

Applicable Equestrian Australia (EA) documents and requirements

- 1. This Equestrian Victoria (EV) event is governed by the Equestrian Australia (EA) General Regulations, applicable EA Sports Rules and all relevant EA Codes, policies, bylaws, rules and regulations. The EA Sports rules (i.e., the National Rules for each EA sport or discipline) and regulations may be accessed on the EA website "Discipline Rules & Regulations" page via the following link http://www.equestrian.org.au/rules. The EA Codes, Policies etc. may be accessed on the EA website "Policies & Bylaws" page via the following link http://www.equestrian.org.au/policies.
- 2. To be eligible to participate in this event you must be a current EA member or current member of an EA state branch. You must also satisfy any further membership or registration requirement (including those for any horse entered) referred to in the General Conditions of Entry for the event (**General Conditions of Entry**) and individual disciplines.
- 3. The EA National Sports Rules applicable to the event are referred to in the Conditions of Entry.
- **4.** All EA and EV events are subject to the EA Code of Conduct (**Code of Conduct**). The Code of Conduct can be accessed on the EA website via the following link http://www.equestrian.org.au/sites/default/files/Equestrian Australia Code of Conduct.pdf It is important that all members understand that the Code of Conduct also covers parents, guardians and spectators in respect of any activity held or sanctioned by EV or an EA state branch. A key aim of the Code of Conduct is to respect the rights of everyone involved, to abide by all EA rules and requirements, to be fair, considerate, honest and professional in all aspects of the sport.
- **5.** EA and EV are committed to the protection and welfare of its members. The EA Member Protection Policy (**MPP**) can be accessed on its website via the following link, https://www.equestrian.org.au/search/node/MEMBER%20PROTECTION%20POLICY EA Child Safeguarding Policy and Victoria's Child Safe Legislation

These are important documents designed to ensure the safe and fair conduct of the event for everyone involved. They should be read, understood and complied with.

- **6.** EA and EV events are also subject to various codes and regulations designed to protect the horse, the welfare of which is paramount (**Horse Welfare Provisions**). Entrants and Competitors must familiarise themselves with the Horse Welfare Provisions and ensure that they are complied with. These Provisions may be accessed on the EA website via the following link http://www.equestrian.org.au/policies.
- 7. If the event is conducted at Werribee Park National Equestrian Centre (WPNEC), the WPNEC Centre Safety Rules shall apply to the event which may be accessed via the following link http://wpnec.com.au/safety/

Entrants and Competitors bound by EA documents.

- **8.** Entrants and Competitors must familiarise themselves with the provisions of the EA documents referred to above (**EA documents**) and ensure that they comply with them.
- **9.** By submitting an entry for the event you agree to comply with and be bound by the provisions of the EA documents, these Special Conditions, and the General Conditions of Entry.
- **10**. If you are the parent or guardian of a participant or competitor under the age of 18 years, by submitting an entry for the event you consent to their participation in the event and undertake to the best of your ability to ensure that they understand and comply with the provisions of the EA documents, these Special Conditions, and the General Conditions of Entry.
- 11. If there is any conflict in the interpretation between the provisions of the General Regulations and any of the EA documents, these Special Conditions or the General Conditions of Entry, the General Regulations will take precedence. If there is any conflict in the interpretation between the provisions of these Special Conditions and the General Conditions of Entry, the Special Conditions will take precedence.

Organising Committee

12. The Organising Committee may at its absolute discretion, decline to receive any entry or return any fee without being liable for any compensation: General Regulation, Article 116.11. The Organising Committee's decision in relation to any entry for the event shall be final and binding.

Cancellation, Postponement and Refund

13. EVENT CANCELLATION/POSTPONEMENT POLICY: EV or the Organising Committee, at its/their absolute discretion, may cancel the event at any time due to force majeure (e.g. threatened or abnormal weather conditions including fire, storm or flood), pandemic restrictions, health or safety concerns or any event beyond their reasonable control. In the event of cancellation, EV or the Organising Committee will notify each Team Manager (if any) and competitors at the earliest possible opportunity. Entrants who have provided an email address and/or mobile phone number with their entry form will be notified by email and/or text message. If the event is cancelled prior to commencement any refund will be determined at the absolute discretion of Equestrian Victoria in consultation with the Organising Committee having regard to its/their direct or fixed costs expenses incurred or payable by reason of the cancellation. Event creditors and suppliers with legitimate claims will be paid prior to any refunds being made to competitors. If the event is cancelled after it has commenced there will be no refund.

POSTPONEMENT: If the event is postponed, prior to commencement or during the event, for whatever reason, any refund will be determined at the absolute discretion of Equestrian Victoria, having regard to the direct or fixed costs for the event. If the event is postponed after it has commenced there will be no refunds.

14. The refund policy for withdrawal, scratching or change of an entry is set out in the General Conditions of Entry.

Release and Indemnity

- 15. You acknowledge that horse riding, working with or being around horses can be dangerous. Horses can act in sudden and unpredictable ways, especially if frightened or hurt. Consequently, there is a real risk of damage to property, serious injury or even death. In consideration of acceptance of your entry and participation in the event you agree to release and forever discharge EA, EV, their servants and agents and the Organising Committee and each member thereof from all claims, proceedings or demands for any loss or damage howsoever arising from any accident or incident Occurring at the event.
- **16.** In consideration of acceptance of your entry and participation in the event, you agree to indemnify and keep indemnified EA, EV, their servants and agents and the Organising Committee and each member thereof against all claims, proceedings or demands brought by or on behalf of any participant or competitor named in your entry form for any loss or damage howsoever arising from any accident or incident Occurring at the event.

GENERAL CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- 17. Entries Open: Friday 10th November 2023 at 9.00am
- 18. Entries Close: Friday 15th December at 10 pm
- **19. Late Entries:** From 9am on Monday 1st January 2024 to 10pm on Sunday 7th January 2024 late entries will be accepted but will incur a \$50 late fee per class
- **20. Administration Fee:** A \$30.00 non-refundable Administration Fee will be charged to each exhibitor.
- **SCRATCHING/ REFUNDS** Scratching before close of entry date in December will receive a refund of fees, less the non-refundable Administration Fee. Scratching from close of entries in December and close of the late entry period at 10.00pm on 7th January will receive 50% refund of class entry fees, plus facility fees and other fees, if relevant. From 8th January to 31st January a Veterinary or Doctors certificate must be supplied within 24hours of scratching to be eligible for a refund. Upon receipt of a Veterinary or Doctors certificate the refund will comprise facility fees, and 25% of class entry fees. After 31st January there will be no refunds.
- 22. WPNEC Facility Fee: Exhibitors will be required to pay a compulsory Facility fee of \$16.00 per horse/pony, per day.

 This fee will be passed onto the Werribee Park National Equestrian Centre.
- **Registration of Horses:** All horses/ponies competing in EA Classes must be EA registered at time of entry. Refer to EACH section 'Conditions of entry' regarding horse registration. **Stallions are not eligible to compete**.
- **24. Insurance & Membership.** The Equestrian Australia membership number must be shown at time of entry. It is recommended that competitors print a copy of their Entry and bring this with them to the event, along with a copy of a valid EA height certificate, horses registration/s and membership card/s.

GENERAL CONDITIONS OF ENTRY Cont.

- **25. Level of Membership:** Competitors (owners, riders) for the 2024 Barastoc Horse of the Year Equestrian Victoria Show Horse & Rider State Title classes (Section One) must be an EV Financial member at time of entry as follows:
 - All Riders in State Title classes (Section 1) must be Competitor or Show Horse Member of EV at time of entry.
 - All Owners of exhibits in State Title Classes must be Competitor, Participant, Show Horse or Supporter Members of EV at time of entry.
 - All Handlers in the Leading Rein Classes must be Competitor, Participant, or Show Horse members of EV at time of entry.
 - All Riders in other events (Section Two Owner Rider/Home Produced, Newcomers, Off the Track, Ridden Shetland and Peter Gahan Memorial Trophy & Barastoc Supreme Performer) must be Competitor or Participant or Show Horse members of EA at time of entry.
 - All Owners of Exhibits in <u>Section Two</u> as above must be Competitor, Participant, show horse Competitor or Supporter Members of EA at time of entry.

Please refer to Equestrian Victoria website under Rules, Regs and forms – National Membership Structure for clarification. This regulation is NOT applicable to Breed, Sport Horses or HRCAV or Pony Club classes.

All Owners, riders or handlers must comply with the membership requirements.

Interstate riders are not permitted to ride in the Equestrian Victoria Show Horse & Rider State Titles classes, i.e. in EA Australasian Show Horse & Rider Championship qualifying events.

- **26. Administration Fee: Each Exhibitor** must pay the compulsory, **non-refundable fee of \$30** at the time of entry. This fee encompasses compulsory medical services and event administration.
- 27. Catalogue Fee: \$10 per exhibitor.
- **28. Stabling:** All enquiries can be made by visiting www.wpnec.com.au or by phoning Werribee Park National Equestrian Centre on (03) 9741 7672. Additional forms can be downloaded from WPNEC website or www.vic.equestrian.org.au Stables must not be on sold.
- 29. Medication Control of Horses: will take place in accordance with the Equestrian Australia Equine Anti-Doping and Controlled Medication Regulation (1st edition, effective 2016 and updates). Compulsory medication control fee of \$15 per horse and/or rider class is applicable.
- Measuring: Horses and Ponies <u>not</u> holding a current EA Measurement Certificate <u>must</u> present for measuring prior to competition at times designated by the committee these dates will be communicated prior to the competition.
 Current EA height certificates <u>must</u> be brought to the show and produced, if asked, for verification. Breast plate numbers will be stamped. In the event of a height variation, an exhibit will be transferred to the correct height class in the section the exhibit was originally entered. Express Check In: If your horse has a current height certificate registered on the EA database please use the Express line to check in.
- **Exhibit Numbers:** Exhibit numbers will be supplied by the Organising Committee except for Breed, HRCAV, Pony Club. Exhibitors will be required to collect their Exhibit Numbers from the Event Office on arrival. For classes in this schedule no exhibitor numbers will be distributed without a current EA height certificate being sighted if requested at check in. Exhibitors will be issued with their paid copy of the Program, when collecting Exhibit numbers.
- **32. Handler's Attire:** Horses may be held in the Ring centre during judging; however, handlers must be correctly dressed. Handlers wearing shorts and thongs, or tracksuits will not be permitted into the ring.
- **33. Whips:** The maximum length for whips is 75cm including flaps, excluding exercise.
- **34. Costume:** When riding ponies 14 hands & under, riders must wear jodhpurs and short boots. Riders in Rider Classes under 18 must wear short boots.
- 35. Bits must comply with current EA National show horse rules.

GENERAL CONDITIONS OF ENTRY Cont.

- **36. Newcomers: Definition** A horse that has not competed under saddle (except for Racing) in any State/Territory prior to 1/1/2023. Newcomers may only compete as a newcomer at one Barastoc HOTY show. A Pony that has only competed in Leading Rein or Miniature Turnouts and has not competed off the lead is eligible to be considered a Newcomer. A horse that has competed in breed classes or any other discipline under saddle is <u>not</u> eligible to be considered a Newcomer.
 - (a) The horse must be registered with EA at the time of close of entries.
 - (b) The horse must have a current EA Height Certificate at time of competition.
 - (c) The horse must be shown in a snaffle bridle in accordance with current EA National Show Horse Rules
 - (d) The horse may compete in the relevant State HOTY event as its first competition.
 - (e) The horse may compete in the Open section at the HOTY subject to State/Territory qualifying rules where applicable.
 - (f) All interstate horses must be registered and/or transferred 3 months and 1 day immediately preceding the date of the State Titles Horse of the Year event.

37. Owner Rider/Home Produced

The aim of these classes is to provide events for competitors who own and care for their own horse/s on a daily basis and produce their horse/s for showing without the external assistance of a "professional" stable or business or individual. Education is encouraged but assistance in caring and producing the horse/s for showing by individuals associated with a professional stable or business is not in keeping with the intention of these classes.

- **38. EA Australasian Show Horse & Rider Championships 2024.** Winners, Runners Up and Third placegetters in State Title Child's classes and State Title Rider and Open and Hunter Classes will qualify to represent Victoria at the 2024 EA Australasian Show Horse & Rider Championships.
- **39. Class Restrictions:** Horses are to be shown as either Show Hack or Show Hunter for the entire show.
- 40. Workouts: Set workouts will be advised for all State Title Classes, and newcomer classes. These shall be published on the website following close of entries. Owner Rider/Home Produced workouts will be published on the website following the close of entries. Off the Track workouts will be published on the website following close of entries.
 Barastoc Supreme Performer workouts will be advised by the judge on the day.
- **41. Prizes:** Prizes not collected on the day will be forfeited.
- **Qualifications:** No qualifications will be required for Barastoc HOY 2024. In the event of excessive entries being received the Committee reserves the right to amend the format of judging.
- **43. Age of Horses:** The minimum age of a horse competing in Saddle Sections is three (3) years of age.
- **44. Judges:** Judges for Equestrian Victoria Show Horse & Rider State Title classes are randomly selected by the National Office of Equestrian Australia, from the current EA Show Horse Judges List.
- **45. Eligibility for Classes:** The onus is on the owner / exhibitor to ensure the horse and/or rider are eligible to compete under any of the Judges concerned. **NO JUDGE WILL STAND ASIDE FOR THE JUDGING OF ANY CLASS.**
- **46. Protests:** For protests, please refer to Rule 1.5 Protests Pertaining to the Application of Competition Rules & Conditions of Entry in the current EA National Show Horse Rules EV has the sole and unfettered power to determine any protests not otherwise provided for under rule 1.5. A Protest Fee of you \$150 payable at the time the protest is lodged and refundable if the protest is upheld.

Important Notes:

- Article 116 of the EA General Regulations, which apply to this event, entitles the Organising Committee in its absolute and unfettered discretion to reject any entry, even after an entry has been accepted.
- This Competition Schedule is subject to change as Sponsorship Agreements are finalised and prizes updated.
- The Organising Committee reserves the right to change the judges and/or alter the timetable.



(Extract from EA National Show Horse rules – State Title Classes, Sect. One)

- 5. STATE HORSE OF THE YEAR AND RIDER CHAMPIONSHIPS These rules are to be adhered to by the State Organising Committees in the conduct of State Horse of the Year and Rider Championships and only refer to those classes that qualify horses/riders for the Australasian Show Horse and Rider Championships. All State Committees that do not adhere to these rules may render all riders and horse's ineligible for competing at that year's Australasian Horse and Rider Championships at the discretion of the EASHC. In the event that a competitor has more than one horse in a class, the rider will be permitted to ride multiple horses, however every horse must do a 'go around' for all classes in which case another rider will need to be elected. The nominated rider must adhere to the age restrictions of the class. The State HOTY event is to be conducted under these Rules and the provisions set out below.
- 5.1 **Owner and Lessee** All owner and lessees listed on current registration papers must hold a current EA membership at the time of entry. Refer to the EA General Regulations Article 100.
- 5.2 **State membership** Horses can only be entered at State HOTY by a current member of the EA in the State in which the event is being held.
- 5.3 **Show Horse, Show Hunter and Leading Rein Classes** all horses must have current height certificates. Measuring Rules: please refer to the EA measuring rules and check from updates effective 1.1.2024.
- 5.4 **Rider of the Year classes** Riders may only compete in the class for which they are eligible Age is as of 1st January in the year of the National Championships Show Horse, Show Hunter, Childs/Junior Rider of the Year classes, with exception of Leading Rein (see definition 5.5).
- 5.5 **EA Membership category** All competitors must be full current EA Competitive members and leading rein handlers must be current Participant or Competitive members of EA in the State in which the event is being held: **5.5.1 Childs Classes** The rider must be aged between 5 years and under 18 years as of 1st January in the year of the National (Australian) Championships. **5.5.2 Leading Rein Classes** for Lead rein riders turning 5 years the age of 5 commences from the child's birthday. The Under 8 age limit is taken as per the child's age as at 1st January in the calendar year that the competition is being held. Handler must be 18 years of age and over.
- **5.6 HOTY Open classes, Show Horse, Show Hunter, Childs/Junior, Leading Rein Classes and Rider Classes Horses/Ponies must be**: **5.6.1** Horses must be EA registered at the time of entry (as per rule 4.2) **5.6.2** 3 years of age or over at 1 August **5.6.3**Resident in the State applies to interstate horses changing ownership (including where appropriate within a 100km radius of a border) must be registered and/or transferred 3 months and 1 day before their state HOTY. Northern Territory to be exempt from 3 month and 1-day residency rule. (Rule update: from 1.1.24 3 months & 1 day will be changed to 90 days) **5.6.4** For Newcomer Classes, if the horse has not competed under saddle (with the exception of horse racing) in any state and is registered and eligible/qualified in the state in which it is to compete by closing date of entries it shall be eligible to compete in that respective state's HOTY.
- **5.7.1** Show Horse, Show Hunter, Childs/Junior and Leading Rein If a horse has competed in a qualifying class at an EA HOTY in the current year in another State it is not eligible to compete in another EAHOTY in the same calendar year **5.7.2** Rider Classes If a rider has competed in an EA HOTY in the current year in a qualifying class in another State, they are not eligible to compete in another EA HOTY in the same calendar year. **5.7.3** Show Hunters If a horse/pony is entered as a Show Hunter at a State HOTY, it will be precluded from entering the State Horse of the Year as a Show Horse and vice versa. **5.7.4** Amnesty to compete Should a horse that has competed at the Australasian Show Horse and Rider Championships wish to compete at a State Horse of the Year in the following calendar year, where the State's Horse of the Year is held within 3 months of the Australasian Show Horse and Rider Championships an amnesty may Occur in regard to this rule. This rule became effective at the completion of the 2017 Australasian Show Horse and Rider Championships. **5.7.5** Ownership Change All Changes of ownership and relevant paperwork must be completed by the EA Branch within 7 business days immediately following the completion of the Australasian Show Horse and Rider Championships.



5.8 International HOY Show Horse, Show Hunter, Childs/Junior and Leading Rein If a horse has competed in an international qualifying class at a HOY event in the current year it is not eligible to compete in State EA HOTY in the same calendar year.

5.9 To Judge State Horse of the Year Judges must have a minimum of two years' experience on a State or National list. 5.9.1 Judge Allocation - Local A maximum of two judges from any one state are permitted. 5.9.1.1 Due to special circumstances, for example a pandemic, national or state emergency, or if for whatever reason state borders are closed, a state may be permitted to source their judges from within their own state or from a state not affected by closure, upon request to the National Show Horse Committee. 5.9.2 Judge Allocation - Random Draw Judges will be randomly selected by the National EA Office. 5.9.3 Judge Appointment Form Selected Judges will need to be sent a Judging Form from EA to complete and will be asked to provide details of: • Any actual or perceived conflicts of interest • Any State Horse of the Year or Royal Show or Southern Cross Show Horse Spectacular judging positions the selected judge has either accepted or judged at during the calendar year • Any horse (including rider classes) that the selected judge has qualified to compete at the Australasian Show Horse & Rider Championships in the same calendar year. Note – if the selected judge has qualified a horse in a particular class, they will be deemed ineligible to judge that class at any State Horse of Year. • Any horse, where the selected judge is the competitor (see definition of competitor) in which they anticipate competing at their State Horse of the Year Championships 5.9.4 Return of Appointment Form Submitting the Judges Form does not mean the selected judge is accepted to judge the State Horse of the Year. 5.9.5 Organising Committee - Judges The Organising Committee of the State Horse of the Year will make a determination as to whether it is viable for the selected judge to officiate based upon any declaration(s) the selected Judge has made in their Judges Form 5.9.6 Judging Rotation The Organising Committee, where possible, will make every attempt to rotate judges out of specific classes where a conflict is declared by the selected judge. If this is not viable, the Organising Committee may request that the State EA Office select an alternative judge. 5.9.7 Judges may only Judge one State HOTY per calendar year

- **5.12 Judge Decision** the Judge's decision is final. **5.13 Placings** At a minimum, a winner, runner-up and third place getter are to be sashed and announced at the event.
- **5.14 Judge Number ratio** in qualifying Show Horse, Show Hunter, Childs/ Junior and Rider classes four judges must be used as per the National Show Horse Judging System. If there is less than a total of 100 entries in all qualifying classes, three judges may be permitted (excluding Northern Territory due to geographic isolation, a minimum of two judges must be appointed).



- **5.15 Class numbers** All qualifying events for the Australasian Show Horse and Rider Championships (i.e.: State HOTYs) must be run by the States Show Horse Committee (who may form or co-opt an organising subcommittee). States may offer combined Child/Junior classes that will be split if there are 3 or more competitors entered in each section. Where split Child/Junior classes have less than 3 competitors in a class at the discretion of the Organising Committee these classes may be combined, i.e. instead of 2 Galloway classes with less than 3 in each they be combined to 14h up to inc. 15hds.
- **5.16 Results** Results of the winner, runners-up and third place getter, and the names of all Finalists (top 10) to be sent to the relevant EA State Branch Office within 14 days of competition.
- **5.17 Chief Steward**/Judges host The Chief Steward and Judge's host must be independent, and this must be reflected in the State's program.
- **5.18 Scorer** A scorer may not officiate in any class where they have a Conflict of Interest or perceived Conflict of Interest and will not have any deliberate contact with the Judges prior to the class/classes or in which the Conflict of Interest occurs.
- 5.19 State & National Badges No State or National badges may be worn at State Horse and Rider of the Year competitions.
