Dressage – Horse Competition Online (entry fee \$25 per class) - Rider must nominate which ridden test will be counted toward High Point when entering in the competition online. That test will be classed as one of the 8 ridden classes for Sunday at WA ANMS 2020. (If there are 8 ridden classes performed at the show, the lowest placing will be dropped and the Dressage placing included. Once the Dressage is nominated as a High Point test, it cannot be dropped. As well as being a horse welfare limit, the 8 ridden classes per day also keeps the High Point Award on a level playing field).

VERSATILITY FEES \$100 – Classes open only to those who nominate for the Versatility Challenge. Versatility in Hand and Versatility Ridden classes are <u>not</u> eligible for the High Point Awards, but overall placing in Versatility Challenge will earn points toward High Point

Versatility Challenge Classes – from the By-Laws

Pure Breds and Part Breds shown together.

- a) <u>Class 1. Working In Hand</u>: To showcase the horse's obedience and training in hand to a high degree of excellence. The Show Committee will select from 4 possible patterns to suit the venue and the demographic of the particular ANMS. Patterns provided by MHAA board. Attire and gear from any discipline may be worn, but mixing and matching is not allowed.
- b) Class 2. Long Reining: To demonstrate the obedience and training in this discipline to a high degree of excellence. The Show Committee will select from 4 possible patterns to suit the venue and the demographic of the particular ANMS. Patterns provided by MHAA board. Long reining is defined as an "in-hand" technique where the horse is equipped with a saddle or surcingle, bridle, and a pair of long "reins" which are held by a handler who walks behind the horse and drives him forward. Full harness may be worn but is not required.
- c) <u>Class 3. Versatility Ridden</u>: To demonstrate the education, range of paces and tractability of the horse under saddle to a high degree of excellence. Workout to be devised by Show Committee to demonstrate the following elements: Working on the bit; Walk, Trot and Canter both directions; Lengthening at the trot; Lengthen at the canter; Square halts; min 6 cavalletti (may be set separate

or in a grid), and rein back. Attire and gear from any discipline may be worn, but mixing and matching is not allowed

- d) <u>Class 4. Challenge Course</u>: To show the manoeuvrability, education and partnership of horse and rider to a high degree of excellence. MHAA Board will provide a list of 15 obstacles for this event, 8 of which the show committee will select to suit the space available at the venue. Attire and gear from any discipline may be worn, but mixing and matching is not allowed
- e) <u>Class 5. Trotting Race</u>: distance 800 metres, or once around a trotting track. Should a horse break gait (canter), the rider must turn a full circle before continuing. Three breaks of gait receives elimination. Show Committee to put a proposal to MHAA Board on how this race is to be run (in a group or timed heats) depending on venue facilities. Attire and gear from any discipline may be worn, but mixing and matching is not allowed.
