Campdraft competitors must be an ABCRA member, both Day or Annual Membership is acceptable.

GENERAL INFORMATION

1. Volunteers are crucial to run this event. Every rider will pay a bond of \$50.00 which will be refunded after the event if the volunteer has performed their duties. If a duty is found not to be fulfilled, another volunteer can step in and get paid \$50.00. Head Stewards from each discipline will be monitoring their volunteers. Any volunteer who does not do their shifts will jeopardize any future entries at next year's event. If multiple shifts are performed it will be up to the Committee's discretion of amount paid to this volunteer. The volunteers levy will be reimbursed within four weeks after the event.
2. **VOLUNTEERS' ROSTER:** The volunteers' roster will be available prior to the commencement of the event. Every rider/horse combination must have a helper and all jobs must be done or a substitute person nominated. The organising committee will take all reasonable steps to avoid clashes between the draw and helper's rosters, however no guarantees are provided. All schools and Independents will be rostered to help in all events. **PLEASE NOTE: If a school/independent does not complete their shifts the Committee can refuse for that rider to participate and will be ineligible to receive points.**
3. All competitors must wear a safety helmet approved by NSW Pony Club or Equestrian Australia (EA). All Helmets must be tagged.
4. **Social Media:** Internet social networks such as Instagram, YouTube, Facebook, and other forums have proven to be a great way for people to share information, ideas and opinions and keep in touch with family and friends. We ask that all interschool riders and families treat their fellow riders, officials, judges, and coaches with respect by ensuring the language and comments they use are respectful, treating others, as they would like to be treated.
5. It has come to our attention that in the past some people may have posted disparaging and inappropriate comments and materials. It is important to remember that such conduct is absolutely unacceptable and is not in line with Interschool values and EA Codes of Conduct. Breaches of the Codes of Conduct may lead to disciplinary action.
6. Only students enrolled at a school (K-12), TAFE (Yrs 7–12 (not apprenticeships)) or via distance education/home schooled may compete at ISHE 2024. The age of competitors **will be their age as at 17 October 2024 unless otherwise stated.** In the event of ISHE being oversubscribed the Committee reserve the right to limit the entries. The ISHE committee reserves the right to refuse any entry without reason.
7. This is an interschool children's competition run by volunteers. When entering and competing please be mindful of the spirit of this competition. Be respectful to all officials and volunteers and be mindful of warm-up arena etiquette.
8. All horse disciplines will be conducted according to the Pony Club Association of NSW Regulations and Equestrian Australia (EA) rules. ABCRA Rules apply for Campdraft only.
9. To enter this event the student must have permission from their school **UNLESS YOU RIDE AS AN INDEPENDENT.**
10. **EACH HORSE MUST HAVE A SEPARATE BRIDLE NUMBER. THESE CAN BE PURCHASED FROM ANY EQUINE STORE. The ISHE office will have some emergencies on hand including back numbers for the ODE.** No horse can be ridden or lunged without the official bridle number clearly displayed on the near side of the bridle/halter. It is compulsory to use the bridle number. All scoring is dependent on the number being worn and no results will be recorded for horses not displaying a number. This applies to ALL classes. Bridle numbers are required in case a horse gets loose so Committee can contact owner immediately.
11. **ALL RIDERS MUST WEAR A MEDICAL ARM BAND AT ALL TIMES WHILST RIDING THEIR MOUNT. These can be purchased at any equine outlet.**
12. A Veterinarian will be on site for the duration of the Event. You will need to pay for any medications needed at the time.
13. The committee reserves the right to alter or delete items from the program at their discretion and to cap disciplines when needed.
14. The ISHE committee reserves the right to vet out any horse they deem unfit or unable to compete safely at any stage of an event. Any ill treatment of horses will incur instant elimination. No stallions will be permitted on the grounds.

15. Stewards will marshal riders to their events and reserve the right to stand down any rider found to have unsafe or inappropriate gear.
16. Lunging of horses and the warming up of horses is permitted only in designated warm up areas.
17. No pushbikes or scooters including E-Bikes and E-Scooters are permitted on the grounds.
18. No riding of horses after dark unless competing in an event. No riding of horses without a bridle and saddle unless required in competition. No riding of horses that are wearing rugs.
19. In the spirit of interschool competition, no parent, team manager, or instructor will coach riders from inside the arenas at any time. This rule will be strictly enforced and may result in the elimination of the rider from the event.
20. All children 7 years and under participating must be competent independent riders. This rule applies to all ages.
21. Competitors are required to walk at all times on the grounds except in warm up area and when competing. "Hooning" around on horses between events is not allowed.
22. Please ensure your competitors are on time and in the correct location for their events.
23. **Scratching** – To be notified to the Secretary's Office as early as possible.
24. The following conditions apply:
 - a) **Closing date is 19th September 2024 .**
 - b) **After entry fees will be forfeited unless a medical or veterinary certificate is received. A 15% administration fee will be retained where refunds are approved under medical/vet grounds.**
 - c) **Any changes to entries after will incur a \$10.00 admin fee.**
 - d) **All claims/refunds to be finalized by 31 December 2024.**
25. **NO DOGS ALLOWED ON THE GROUNDS** – only exception being dogs entered in classes for Saturday night. AELEC is run under Tamworth Regional Council therefore as part of the agreement there are to be NO DOGS.
26. To ride at this event the rider does not have to be a pony club member, but you must be a member of EA or ISHE for a small fee of \$10.00 (event membership). An ambulance fee of \$15.00 is also payable for the entire event.
27. Schools may enter any number of students.
28. School ties, beige or white jodhpurs/breeches and school jumpers/vests to be worn – NO COATS. School sports shirts may be worn in sporting events. EA approved gear may be worn.
30. To be eligible for championship points there must be more than three (3) entries in each age group.
31. Judge's decision is FINAL.
32. Cancellations due to wet weather will be announced over Radios 2TM and 100.3 Armidale after the 6.00 am news on the day or ring 0428 861 559 for a recorded message. Please also check our Facebook page.
33. Any competitor who wishes to participate with ISHE must complete the electronic Disclaimer Statement and Medical Information Sheet with Nominate. Non competitors i.e., parents, spectators or persons assisting students at the event are not covered by our insurance. Voluntary workers, committee members, judges, officials, and administrators are covered for both personal and accident and products and public liability. Please see FAQ regarding insurance attached to this documentation under EA's Interschools Policy. ISHE takes no responsibility for persons (other than the ISHE Organising Committee) on the grounds areas outside the period 3.00pm Thursday, 17 October 2024 to 6.00 pm on Monday 21 October 2024.
34. ISHE is conducted independently of the Department of Education and Training, Independent and Catholic Education systems. It is the responsibility of competing schools to ensure that their students are competing in accordance with the requirements of their particular educational system.
35. **HENDRA VACCINATION.** This vaccination is the single most effective way of reducing the risk of Hendra virus infection in both horses and humans. Human infection and deaths have occurred following high-level exposure to body fluids from infected horses. Vaccinating horses is an important measure to prevent this occurring and provides a public health and workplace health and safety benefit. The vaccine must be administered by a veterinarian. Some veterinarians may refuse to attend unvaccinated sick horses. All parents/guardians should also be aware of the correct biosecurity procedures if they do not vaccinate their horses against the Hendra virus. For further information please see the Department of Primary Industries -

It is NOT compulsory to have your horses vaccinated for this event but if they are up to date, please complete the necessary details on the entry form via Nominate.

36. Schools and riders enter at their own risk. A Waiver Form must be ticked by parent or guardian when entering online.
37. Random drug testing of horses may be performed throughout the duration of the event.
38. NO glass is allowed on the grounds and all electrical leads must be tested and tagged.
39. No horse shall be shared in any one discipline i.e., "Maggie" cannot be ridden by J Citizen in the 90 cm showjumping and then by P Citizen in the 75 cm showjumping. The exception will be campdrafting ONLY as per ABCRA rules.
40. **No adult is to ride a horse once on the grounds due to insurance purposes otherwise that child/horse may be eliminated. No spectators are permitted to ride on a competitor's horse.**

TEAM MANAGERS RESPONSIBILITIES

1. All Team Managers must be approved by their School Principal. All nominations must be approved by the Team Manager appointed by that school.
2. While the students are not competing, they are the sole responsibility of the Team Manager. Team Managers owe a Duty of Care to their students and are responsible for the supervision and behavior of students at all times. Team Managers are totally responsible for the conduct of their riders. Should there be any queries or problems during the day, the **Team Manager** is the person designated to negotiate on behalf of the rider/school.
3. Team Managers must ensure that each rider's equipment is **SAFE** and are responsible for their team. Smooth soled boots and the following helmets will be allowed and must be tagged:
 - Current Australian standard **AS/NZS 3838** (2006 onwards) *provided they are SAI Global marked.*
 - New Australian standard **ARB HS 2012** *provided they are SAI Global marked.*
 - Current American standard **ASTM F1163** (2004a or 04a onwards) *provided they are SEI marked.*
 - Current American standard **SNELL E2001**.
 - Current British standard **PAS 015** (1998 or 2011) *provided they are BSI Kitemarked.*
 - Interim European Standard **VG1** (01.040: 2014-12) with or without BSI Kitemark.

Random checks will be performed throughout the day. Any queries to be directed to stewards.

4. Team Managers are required to carry out a gear check on all their competitors and horses according to Pony Club Association and EA guidelines. Gear must be checked prior to the 8.00 am start and if a rider replaces or changes gear prior to commencing another discipline.
5. Disputes and Protests - the Team Manager must lodge appeals in writing as soon as is practical on a ISHE Competitor Query Form after results being posted, together with a fee of \$50.00 (refunded if protest upheld) to the Secretary's office. The dispute will be referred to the head steward. When the dispute has been answered the Team Manager will be called to the Secretary's Office to receive a reply. The committee's decision is final. The Team Manager is the only person to attend the Secretary's Office for any information, results, complaints, queries etc of any nature during the ISHE Event. Information will not be given to the competitor, parent, or guardian.
6. It is the competitor's/team manager's responsibility to know when the courses are open for walking and the start time of each event. Draw times are an indication of how the day will run. A "move up draw" will apply if scratching occurs.
7. Opening hours of the office will be as per roster on display at office door. Due to a small committee the office will not always be open.

FRQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

- 1. What Insurance is ISHE covered by?**
EA (Equestrian Australia), together with Gow-Gates Insurance Brokers, have arranged a National Insurance Programme to benefit all affiliated clubs who elect to take out EA Club Insurance.
- 2. What cover do riders have if they are a member of EA?**
If you are an EA member you will be covered by both personal accident and public liability.
- 3. Do I have to wear the correct helmet?**
All competitors must wear a safety helmet approved by NSW Pony Club or Equestrian Australia (EA). You will not be covered by insurance if the rider does not wear the correct helmet as listed above. Your helmet must be tagged.
- 4. What insurance do I have if I am not a member of EA?**
You will be covered by public and products liability only. Personal accident will be covered by either Medicare or if you are a member of a private medical fund.
- 5. Do I need to be a member of Equestrian Australia to ride at ISHE?**
No, but you will need to be a member of ISHE - Tamworth Inc. for a small fee of \$10.00 called "event membership". Once you are an ISHE club member you will receive public and products liability whilst engaged in activities organised by ISHE. Should participants wish to obtain cover under the Personal Accident policy, they are encouraged to become EA members.
- 6. Are volunteers covered by insurance?**
All voluntary workers, committee members, judges, officials, and administrators are covered by *personal accident and public and products liability*.
- 7. Is Day Membership still available for non-EA members?**
Day membership is no longer offered by EA however clubs are required to ensure that all participants are either direct EA members or members of the Club. EA understands that full EA or club membership may not suit all participants and clubs/associations are therefore able to offer membership on a short-term basis (i.e., event membership).
- 8. Are EA affiliated club members covered for Personal Accident?**
No, club members receive Public Liability cover only whilst engaged in activities organised and/or run by an affiliated association or club. See Q4 above.

- Callers and/or Whips for dressage section are NOT permitted.
- No stock saddles or wranglers allowed.
- To enter a signed current Pony Club ODE card for Riders in EvA80 and below is required, or recent EA Eventing results at the equivalent level. Entry checks will be conducted.
 - CCN1* riders must have 3 EvA95 MERs.
 - CCN2* riders must have 3 MERs at CCN1*.
- **Riders in EvA95 and above are required to be 'Competitive' Equestrian Australia members. Horses competing at this level need to have an Equestrian NSW Eventing Competition License**
- Riders must have ridden three EvA80 events before nominating in the EvA95cm.
- Riders in EvA80 and below can be 'Participant or Competitive' members of Equestrian Australia or be members of the ISHE Club. Club members do not have personal insurance. Non-EA members (Club members) must have a Pony Club grading card or Eventing results at the same level. See link <http://www.equestrian.org.au/home> for more detail.
 - It is **mandatory** that you have Minimum Eligibility Requirements.
- Ages for heights are as follows:
 - *2* Classes – From the beginning of the calendar year in which he reaches the age of 14. EA Express Permission is required unless the rider is in the year of turning 18.*
 - *CCN 1* Classes - From the beginning of the calendar year in which the rider reaches the age of 13.*
 - *EvA95 Classes: From the beginning of the calendar year in which the rider turns 8. Riders under the age of 13 must have a MER at EvA80.*
 - *Eva80 Classes: From the beginning of the calendar year in which the rider turns 8. Any rider under 11 years must have EA or PC results to address any safety concerns that may arise. For any further clarification please see link: <https://www.equestrian.org.au/Eventing-rules>.*
- Minimum age to compete in ODE will be from the beginning of the calendar year in which the rider reaches the age of 8.
- It is **compulsory** that all riders wear approved body protectors and a tagged approved helmet at all times when mounted.
- **All riders to supply their own back number holder, medical arm band and a bridle number.**
- **1st Place will receive a Rug, 2nd Place will receive a Saddle Cloth, with Rosettes to 6th Place for each class.**

Rider 2 rides to pole 4, collects the mug and places it on pole 3, collects the mug from pole 2 and places it on pole 1, and rides to cross the Start/Finish line. Rider 3 repeats the actions of Rider 1, and Rider 4 repeats the actions of Rider 2. Poles knocked over must be put back up on their mark, and dropped mugs must be replaced on the correct pole, before proceeding.
