STRICTLY NO ENTRY BEFORE 1:00 PM ON MONDAY 21st FEBRUARY 2022

Camping sites for the 2022 Royal Canberra Show have dramatically changed due to changes to the physical grounds of EPIC and the needs of the RNCAS. Traditional camping locations may no longer be in existence because of issue associated with COVID testing. New camping sites will be developed to cater for the larger transport rigs.

Please ensure you read the site rules and requirements before applying for camping.

Please indicate on your entry form if you require Camping & Stabling. Payment will be required following notification of acceptance of entries. Camping & Stabling must be paid for by 5pm, Monday 10th January 2022.

Camping is only permitted for the period from 1.00pm Monday 21st February 2022 to 9.30am Monday 28th February 2022.

A standard camping site is 10m x 3m; however larger sites are available for larger size vehicles, with fees on a sliding scale. If your vehicle(s) or camping facilities, when fully set up, exceed 10m X 3m you are required to book extra space, enough to accommodate your vehicle(s) and all other equipment as set up. Please ensure annexes are included in your measurements.

If your camping equipment exceeds your allocated space, you will be moved to another location at the direction of the Camping Staff. Every vehicle must be listed when entering online to receive authorised camping stickers. Vehicles must be housed only on the site booked. Any additional vehicles not authorised will be removed from the camping zones and moved to the offsite parking areas.

Camping site costs – all sites are booked for the period 1 pm Monday 21st February to 9.30am Monday 28th February 2022 inclusive regardless of length of stay. Fees are payable in advance as per the table.

Electricity

Many vehicles require connection to more than one 15-amp power outlet. If you require more than one 15-amp outlet, additional power can be supplied at \$120.00 per 15-amp outlet. Each power outlet paid for will qualify for an authorised tag to attach to your lead. All leads must be provided by Exhibitors and must have a current safety test and tag.

Unauthorised & untagged leads will be removed.

Note: it is compulsory for ALL leads (even brand-new leads) to have been safety tested & tagged before they can be used on the grounds.

Camping Rules

At all times campers must abide by the directions given by the Camping Supervisor or their support staff. Failure to abide by the Camping Staff directions will lead to removal from the site. With over 5,000 campers each camping group must stay on their allocated space and not impinge on any other camp site or camping group.

When applying for camping via the online system, it is agreed that you have read and understood all camping rules and regulations and will abide by them.

CAMPING TABLE: SITE SIZES AND FEES

How to work out your camping site requirements

- NB: Traditional camping locations may no longer be in existence due to issues associated with COVID testing on the grounds.
- Camping on the grounds is in very high demand. There are restrictions on how many vehicles will be allowed. Exhibitors are entitled to book ONE camping 'site'. A single site can accommodate ONE of the following 2 options:
- One car/ute/4WD and one of the following: caravan or horse trailer/float or tent OR
- One articulated vehicle combination e.g. one towing vehicle & one-horse float OR one complete gooseneck rig or Semi-trailer
- Any additional car/ute/4WD, truck, tent, caravan, trailer or float is considered a 'service' vehicle and may not be included on this single site; Exhibitors are to apply for a secondary site large enough to accommodate this extra vehicles/equipment and this site will only be allocated if there is sufficient space. If there is not enough room, extra vehicles can be parked in the public car park just outside Gate 8 at no charge (a pass will be provided). Powered and Non-Powered sites are not available as adjacent sites. You can book a powered camping site as your main camping site and a non-powered site as a secondary site to accommodate extra vehicles, but these sites will not be located together. Measure the vehicles that you wish to have parked on your main camping site. Work out the total space required then consult the table below to work out the fees payable when using the online system. Please note that ALL camping sites must be fully paid for at the time of booking.

Camping Refunds

- Exhibitors who withdraw from the Show up to 4.30pm on 31st January 2022 may be eligible for a refund of any paid camping fees less an administration fee of \$100. Refunds will only be paid if the Horse Section is notified in writing by the deadline specified. Exhibitors who withdraw after these deadlines or do not notify the society in writing by the deadlines, will not be eligible for any refund.
- Every endeavour will be made to locate camping sites near where your horses are located. However, the layout of the grounds and stables means that many people will not be able to be camped close to their horses. Please ensure you read the site rules and requirements before applying for camping. All applications for camping must be made at the same time as entering your horses for the 2022 Show.

STABLING BY – LAWS

STABLING SUPERVISOR HOURS DURING SHOW:

Monday 21st February 2022 1:00pm – 6:00pm

Tuesday 22nd Feb to Sunday 27th Feb 2022 6:00am – 6:00pm

STRICTLY NO ENTRY BEFORE 1:00 PM ON MONDAY 21st February 2022.

- Bedding will be available for purchase from Brindabella Stock feeds for the 2022 Show & delivered daily where possible to your allocated stable on your nominated arrival date. Stables will be locked so please ensure your nominated arrival & departure date is correct or you will be locked out.
- Stabling is limited and not all exhibitors will be offered stabling. Acceptance of entries does not guarantee stabling.
- Stabling allocations are the responsibility of the Stabling Committee, and all decisions are final.
- Please nominate a stable manager if you wish to be stabled with another Exhibitor. Stable manager will send a list of all exhibits to be stabled under their name in a group. You must all arrive and leave on the same days. Nominate your group early so you don't miss out altogether. This list must be emailed by close of entries as stabling allocation starts after entries close.
- Following confirmation of stabling & camping, payment is required by 5.00pm Monday 17th January 2022. Failure to pay by 5.00pm, Monday 17th January 2022, your stabling and camping will be re-allocated to another competitor.
- **REFUNDS** – Paid stabling fees will be refunded minus an administrative fee of \$50 if the stabling is cancelled in writing before 31st January 2022 and provided the stabling can be reallocated to a horse on the waiting list. Cancellations will be accepted in writing by mail or email only before the cut-off date.
- Withdrawal of an exhibit automatically forfeits your stable.
- Horses that are not allocated a stable at the time of acceptances will automatically go on a stable waiting list.
- Unless an official Withdrawal Notice is received all horses will be assumed to be attending and will remain on the waitlists. An Exhibitor who does not attend and does not withdraw will be responsible for all stabling costs as booked.
- Stable check-in time: From 6.00 am on the nominated day of arrival. Check-out time: Before 6.00 am on the nominated day of departure. (So, if leaving during the day Saturday your departure date will be Sunday by 6.00 am, we will reallocate your stable to another exhibitor to move in at 6am) Stable fees are charged for each day/ night the stable is occupied. Stables not occupied by the assigned horse by 8am and not notified to the Ring Secretary's office will be reallocated. No horses will be granted access prior to 1pm Monday 21st February 2022.
- Stables are allocated to specific horses and are not transferrable. Stables may only be used for housing horses and may not be used for any other purpose (e.g. storing feed or gear). Failure to adhere to this rule will risk exclusion from all competitions.
- Horses may not occupy stables prior to the check in time without the permission of stabling staff.
- All horses must exit by the check-out time as stables will be locked. Stables must be left clean and checked off by stable/camping staff ready for the next occupant. Stable Fails- applies to stables left uncleaned - YOU WILL BE CHARGED \$100 STABLE CLEANING FEE; this fee applies to each individual stable left dirty. Credit card details to be provided at the time of entry, failed stable fees will be charged to the nominated card in the event of a stable fail.
- Horses normally stabled within a 100 km radius of EPIC will not qualify for stabling. You may be put on a wait list if you request a stable.
- Electric fences are not permitted anywhere on the grounds.
- Stabling fees for the 2022 Royal Canberra Show are as follows (all prices include GST):

SHOW CHECKLIST

Please use this checklist as a guide to ensure you have all the information you need before completing your entry!

- PLEASE NOTE: Hard copy proof of registration (identity) is no longer required at time of entry.
- We only require registration papers and microchip numbers upon entering.
- All registration documents (hard copy) for EACH HORSE are required to accompany each horse to the Show.
- Hacks and Hunters require a minimum of one registration, which may be any relevant breed registration or Show Horse Council/EA registration etc. Horses in breed classes must submit the relevant registration papers for each different breed (etc. RPSB, WPCS) where classes are entered at the Show.

Entry Checklist

- ☐ All entries must be completed online. Please make sure that your details and horses' details are accurate. Your entry will not be considered complete until paid in full.
- ☐ For Exhibitors under 18 yrs. a parent/guardian must be nominated, and the nomination will be considered the Exhibitor's contact person.
- ☐ Exhibitor banking details are required for prizemoney payment & Stable Bond Fails. Stable Bond Fails will incur a \$100.00 bond which will be debited to your nominated bank card or prizemoney will be retained to the amount of the stable bond fail. Please complete bank account details at the time of entry. If not completed your prize money will be forfeited.
- ☐ Rider Class entries must include the full name of the rider (no initials).
- ☐ Horse Performance Records - each performance must be within the dates of 1st October 2018 and 29th October 2021.
- ☐ Each horse must include all relevant Registration and Microchip numbers (**Microchip is Mandatory**) except for Standardbred.
- ☐ Exhibitor's Membership of the Royal National Capital Agricultural Society must be completed and paid for prior to completing entries to qualify for the discounted entry (no refunds will be given if entry is completed and paid for prior to the payment of membership).
- ☐ NO entries will be accepted unless paid for in full by COB midnight 29th October 2021.
- ☐ Membership of Breed Societies etc must be current and financial at the time of entry. Pending memberships will not be accepted

SPECIAL HORSE REGULATIONS

EXHIBITION BY-LAWS

Before completing online entries please read carefully. Your completed entry online confirms you have read and abide by the Special Horse Regulations.

INTRODUCTION

These Special Horse Regulations are applicable to the Horse Section only.

The Committee may from time to time resolve that the use of a thing or device by an Exhibitor does not amount to Unethical Conduct in terms of the By-Laws.

DISCLAIMER

The information contained in this publication is gathered for the purpose of providing information to our Exhibitors and Show patrons. The information is a compilation of information provided by third parties and the RNCAS does not warrant its accuracy and advises that any such information may be subject to change or amendment occurring at any time, subject to the RNCAS' legal obligations and responsibilities. If you require confirmation of any information, please contact the RNCAS.

ACCEPTABLE ATTIRE

- For all Attendants and riders on the flat, and show jumping:
- Long trousers/skirts; long sleeved shirt or blouse with collar; tie; stock or cravat; waist coat and/or coat; a brimmed hat or cap (NO baseball type; no fascinators); dark enclosed shoes or boots. NO DENIM.
- Helmet: Approved headgear according to Regulation.
- Breeches or jodhpurs: Fawn, white or cream-coloured.
- Boots: Full grained leather top boots/leather gaiters or Jodhpur boots. No long boots or gaiters to be worn by Riders under 17 competing in riding classes.
- A suitable long-sleeved coat.
- Spurs: If spurs are worn, rowels must be blunt.

Despite the above, the decision of the Chief Steward of a Class (or, in the case of a Grand Parade, any Steward in that parade) as to whether an Attendant's attire is suitable, shall be final.

ADVERTISING

No advertising matter of any description or any mark or sign indicating ownership or identity will be permitted on any Exhibit being judged or whilst in the arena.

AGE AND COMPETENCE OF COMPETITORS

Led and Ridden Classes

A rider must be 5 years of age or over to ride a horse at the Royal Canberra Show.

Subject to the above, a rider/handler must be 18 years or older to ride or handle a colt or stallion at the Royal Canberra Show.

Permission may be sought from the Chief Steward for a rider less than 18 years of age to ride a stallion or colt

n.e.12.2hh. This permission must be sought at least 24 hours prior to the Class and will be granted at the discretion of the Chief Steward.

The Chief Steward may at any time require a person who does not appear to be in full control of the horse whether driving, riding, or leading any horse to either;

- dismount, or
- allow other persons to handle the horse, or
- leave the ring under the supervision of a Red Coat

The age of a person is determined as at the first day of the Show (refer to "Age of Riders" table).

Harness Classes

A junior driver in a Harness Class must be over 12 years and under 18 years and must always be accompanied by an adult experienced driver and wear an approved safety helmet that meets the standards.

A child passenger in a horse-drawn vehicle must be 6 years of age and over and wear an appropriate safety helmet to standard and be accompanied by an experienced harness driver.

AGE OF EXHIBITORS

The age of Junior Riders will be as at the first day of the Show, Thursday 24th February 2022. All Riders must compete in an approved safety helmet.

AGE OF HORSES

The age of a horse is calculated as from 1 August. Every horse foaled before 1 August in any year is deemed to be one year old on that date (refer to "Age of Horses" table).

A filly is a female horse under 4yrs of age. A colt is an ungelded male horse under 4yrs of age.

AGGRESSIVE ANIMALS

Aggressive or uncontrollable behaviour by any horse while under the control of the marshalling stewards or while competing in the arena will render the Exhibit liable for disqualification from the class or classes concerned and from acceptance for entry at future Shows conducted by the Society.

ANIMAL IDENTIFICATION

Registration/Horse identification certificates hard copies must be shown at the time of measuring.

ANIMAL SECURITY

Where an Exhibitor fails to properly secure any animal and bodily injury or property damage occurs, this may constitute a serious breach of insurance policy conditions and prejudice claims settlement.

APPLICATION FOR ENTRY

Entries must be made online at

<https://entries.rncas.org.au/Account/ExhibitorLogin>

and accompanied by card payment.

Entries must be lodged with the Ring Secretary prior to the closing date for entries as specified on the schedule cover.

Entries received after the closing date as specified in the schedule, or entries received unaccompanied by the specified entry fees or registration papers will not be accepted.

Faxed, mailed, email or telephone entries are not acceptable.

ARRIVAL OF EXHIBITS

All horses must be on the Showground by 8am on any day on which a Class in which they are entered is to be judged. Horses coming long distances, and have Stables allocated, may be stabled on the Showground after 1:00 pm Monday 21st February 2022. During the Royal Canberra Show, no horse is permitted to arrive on the grounds prior to 6am of the nominated stabling date. Any Exhibitor who arrives before 6 am will not be permitted onto the Showground.

No horses may be brought onto the grounds that are not competing at the Royal Canberra Show.

CANCELLATION OF THE SHOW

It is agreed between the parties that, if in the sole discretion of the Directors or the Chief Executive Officer or another authorised officer that the Show is to be partially or fully cancelled for any reason whatsoever, the Exhibitor shall not pursue the Society for the recovery of lost income or damages. This complete bar to an action applies to all headings of Law, whether it be Common Law in Contract or Tort or pursuant to any State, Territorial, or Commonwealth Statute Law. It is acknowledged by the Exhibitor that the Society has no duty to have a Show in any particular year and that this Clause operates as a complete defence for the Society to any such action.

CHAMPIONSHIP AWARDS

In Championships Classes, all first prize winners in the nominated Classes must parade.

For the Reserve Championship, all first prize winners in the nominated Classes, except the winner of the relevant Championship Award, together with the second prize winner from the Class which was won by the Champion, must parade.

For the Supreme Championship, all Championship winners from the nominated sections must parade.

Exhibits will only be excused from parading for Champion or Reserve Champion in the case of:

Horse Exhibits - on the production of a certificate from an RNCAS Veterinary Surgeon stating that the Exhibit is unfit to parade.

Riding Competitors - on the production of a Doctor's Certificate stating that the rider is unfit to parade.

Failure to parade when eligible for a Championship, Reserve Championship or Supreme Championship shall render the Exhibitor/Competitor liable to a Penalty of \$150 plus the forfeiture of prize money, ribbons or trophy that may have been awarded in the Class which qualified the Exhibitor/Competitor for the Championship Class.

If a Champion shall be disqualified or shall be found to be unqualified to compete in the Class for which it was entered or to compete for the Championship, then the Award shall be withdrawn. No other Exhibit shall be entitled as of right to the Award, but the Committee may with or without the advice or recommendation of the Judge, decide whether the Award shall be awarded and if so, to which Exhibit.

CHAMPIONSHIP COMPETITIONS

Competitors who have multiple entries eligible for Championship competitions will be permitted to compete with each of their Exhibits. Competitors must present their Exhibits with properly attired riders/handlers into the ring and will be permitted to change onto their other horses for their individual workouts. Competitors should advise the Red Coats and Ring Stewards to allow for an orderly display of their Exhibits.

CHIEF HORSE STEWARD

The powers of the Society, its Board and its Chief Executive Officer described in these General Rules have been delegated, in the respect of the Horse Section, to the Chief Horse Steward.

The Chief Steward may from time to time delegate these authorities.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

Exhibitors must adhere to the Special Horse Regulations in this Schedule (the "Regulations"), as they are bound by these terms.

A condition of entering competitions is strict adherence to the Regulations. Accordingly, Applications for Entry in the name of deceased Person(s) are not eligible for entry.

The Application for Entry and the Regulations constitute the whole agreement upon which Entries are submitted and the Exhibitor agrees that all representations and statements not appearing on the Application for Entry or in the Regulations are excluded.

The Exhibitor certifies that each animal exhibited by them or by their child/children/guardian is duly registered and either their property absolutely or is under their absolute care and control.

The Exhibitor holds the RNCAS exempt from any liability in the event of any loss or damage from any cause whatsoever.

The RNCAS has the power to evict any Exhibitor from the Showground in the event of a breach of the Special Horse Regulations in the 2022 Royal Canberra Horse Show Schedule.

CONSENT OF IMAGES

All Exhibitors, owners and competitors agree to the RNCAS publishing or reproducing information and images associated with them and with their Exhibits at any time, in any medium, for any purpose. This includes live streaming of video, if utilized at the Show.

CONTROL OF SHOW

The Board, CEO or other such authorised representative of the Society shall have the power without assigning any reason to:

- Reject or cancel any entry any time;
- Prohibit the participation by any person or Exhibit in any event or class for which it is entered;
- Cancel any event or class;
- Alter the time at which any class or event is to take place;
- Alter the conditions of any event;
- Remove any Exhibit from Exhibition Park in Canberra i.e. showground
- Alter the date or time for the closing of entries for any section or class or for any entry;
- Transfer an Exhibit or Exhibitor from any class to any other class.

The Exhibitor shall always comply with the directions or requests of the Chief Horse Steward, CEO or other such authorised representative of the Society. This shall without limiting the generality of the foregoing apply to the entry, the animal, the Exhibitor, the conditions of the event, the conduct of the Exhibitor, the conducting of the event, the decisions of the Judge and the awarding of the prize.

The Board, CEO or other such authorised representative of the Society reserve the right to adjudicate on any entry or upon any question in dispute or doubt and to make any determination upon any matter whether covered by the conditions of entry or not. The decision so made shall be final and binding and the Society shall thereby have sole and absolute control of all matters affecting the conduct of the Show and the Exhibits and Exhibitors. There shall be no right of appeal to any court of law or other body from any decision made by the Board, CEO or other such authorised representative of the Society.

The RNCAS reserves the right to rule at any time that any Exhibit, Exhibitor or Competitor may not compete. This right remains notwithstanding the Society's acceptance of entry, its inclusion in the Society's catalogue or the issue by the Society of an Exhibit ticket, number or any other document.

CRUELTY TO HORSES

No Exhibitor shall engage or be knowingly involved in cruelty to a horse. The RNCAS shall be the sole Judge of what constitutes cruelty, but it may include:

- to whip or beat a horse excessively,
- to subject a horse to any kind of electric shock,
- to use spurs, or to jab the horse in the mouth with the bit, excessively or persistently,
- to remount, or attempt to remount, an exhausted, lame or injured horse,
- to rap a horse,
- to hypersensitive any part of a horse,
- or leave a horse without adequate food, drink or exercise,
- excessive exercise, including lunging,
- Tongues may not be tied in any manner.

Any case of cruelty must be reported immediately to the Chief Steward, accompanied by any documentary

evidence in support. Reports more than 7 days after the occurrence will not be considered.

Any case of cruelty must be reported to the Chief Steward. The Society may, in its sole discretion and in the light of all information made available to it, apply penalties which may include, but are not limited to:

- Expulsion from the grounds,
- Disqualification and forfeiture of any prizes won,
- The levying of a monetary fine,
- Disqualification from future Royal Canberra Shows.

DEFINITION OF EXHIBITOR

Exhibitor means for each competition, the person on whose behalf an application for entry is lodged with and accepted by the RNCAS and includes representatives and agents of an Exhibitor. A person includes a natural person, firm, partnership, company or corporation. The following is an example of three different exhibitors in one Competition representing partnerships made up of different persons:

- Jones, West & Clarke
- Jones, Taylor & Johns
- Jones, Taylor, Smith & Kerby

If Exhibits are entered under a partnership, the **same name** should be placed at the beginning of each partnership as shown above.

Please note:

The Nominated Stabling Manager will be used for stabling purposes for large teams. Horse Section must be advised by email by 20 October 2020 of the name of the Nominated Stabling Manager and the Exhibitors and Exhibits that this Manager is responsible for.

The Owner is not required to be an Exhibitor or form part of the Exhibitor name. The Owner will be recorded for each Horse Exhibit.

DEFINITION OF AN OWNER (in Special Horse Regulations)

The Exhibitor is responsible for the care and control of the Exhibit on the Showground and compliance with the Special Horse Regulations.

If the legal owner of the Exhibit is different to the exhibitor, the legal owner/s must be listed on the Application for Entry ('the Owner').

The Owner/s may be jointly responsible for the care and control of the animal and be brought into Disciplinary Proceedings at the RNCAS' discretion.

If an Exhibit is sold after the entry has been made the RNCAS must be notified in writing with a payment of \$50. The seller or the purchaser may make the notification, no later than 21 days before the date of Exhibition

DEFINITION OF A STABLING MANAGER

For all horse competitions, a Stabling Manager MUST be nominated. This person will be responsible for all stabling administration. The Stabling Manager is the reference point for stabling of multiple Exhibits from different Exhibitors together where possible. Stable Manager will need to email the completed list of exhibits to be stabled together by COB 29th October 2021.

DEFINITIONS - OTHER

In these Special Horse Regulations, but subject to the context:

Chief Steward means the Steward appointed by the RNCAS to act as Chief Steward in respect of any Class and includes the Senior Steward and any assistant Stewards of the Horse Section.

Closing Date means the last date on which an Application for Entry to a Show must be received by the RNCAS and is synonymous with the Day of Entry as defined in the General Regulations.

Committee means the Horse Section Committee of the RNCAS.

Horse Events Coordinator means the Person from time to time appointed by the RNCAS to that position.

Horse Section Office means the office designated as such by the RNCAS for a Show.

Ring means the area in which any Class is being or is intended to be conducted.

Ringmaster includes the Ringmaster, any Deputy or Assistant Ringmaster and any Person for the time being exercising some or all the functions of the Ringmaster.

Senior Steward – as appointed by the Chief Steward

Stabling Manager means the Person who is nominated on the Application for Entry and will be responsible for all stabling administration. The Stabling Manager is the reference point for stabling of multiple Exhibits from different exhibitors together where possible.

DEPARTURE/ "CHECK-OUT"

On departure, Exhibitors MUST present their Exhibits' Breastplate to be sighted by the Horse Office for "Check out" and for the checking of stable/s which need to be fully cleaned out. The stable/s will be checked by RNCAS personnel, and if the stable condition is satisfactory, the stable cleaning fee will not be debited. No horses may be stabled on the Showground after 9.30am on Monday 28th February 2022.

DOCUMENTS FOR PRESENTATION WHILST ON THE SHOWGROUND

Horse Registration papers, microchip registration papers, performance cards and birth certificates, or photocopies thereof, are NOT required to be submitted to the RNCAS or accompany an Application for Entry. Such documentation (hard copy) will be required to be on hand whilst the Exhibitor and the Exhibits are on the Showground and must be produced upon request for perusal by the RNCAS Measurers/Identifiers, Ring Steward or other RNCAS Authorised Person, or as otherwise specified by the RNCAS.

DOG'S –

Horse Exhibitors are not permitted to bring dogs onto the Showground. If exhibitors are found to have dogs, both will be removed from the grounds and unable to compete. This will be checked on entry to the grounds.

ELIGIBILITY FOR ENTRY ETC

As at the Closing Date, a horse must be registered with a Breed Society/Association or organisation recognised by the RNCAS and have satisfied the applicable performance requirements.

- Horses blind of an eye may only compete in led Classes.
- A brood mare exhibited in a Class for broodmares is not eligible to compete in any other Stud, Saddle or Harness Classes (Group

Classes, Coloured Led Classes and Clydesdale Mare driven Class accepted).

- An Exhibit which is entered in a Novice Class at the Show and after entry wins a Novice or Open Class at any Royal Show will no longer be eligible to compete as a novice at the Show.
- An Exhibit which has won in a pair and/or fours Class is still considered a novice in Single Classes.
- Horses with docked tails, born on or after 1 August 2007 are not eligible for entry.

ENTER AT OWN RISK

The Exhibitor enters entirely at his or her own risk. In case any Exhibit whilst on the Society Showgrounds shall cause or be the cause of injury or damage to any other Exhibit or Exhibitor or to the personal property of any member of the Society or the general public, the owner of such Exhibit shall indemnify and keep indemnified the Society, its officers, officials and members from and against all damages, costs, claims, expenses or liabilities incurred in connection with such Exhibits. The Exhibitor shall be liable to the Society and its employees, officers and officials for any damage or loss occasioned to any of them by the Exhibit or the Exhibitor or his agent.

ENTRY RESTRICTION

Restrictions or limitations on the number of entries in any section may be made by the Chief Horse Steward.

EQUIPMENT - WHIPS, SNAFFLE BITS, SPURS, & HELMETS

Whips: in ridden Classes shall not exceed 75 cm in total length, except where EA Regulations are stipulated. The length includes the flap. This excludes Ridden Heavy Horse Classes. Working Stock Horses & Side Saddle

Spurs: Spurs which can wound a horse are forbidden. There must be a shank not exceeding 4 cm in length pointing only towards the rear.

Bits: All ridden & harness horses must be shown in a bit except where otherwise stated in the RNCAS Horse Schedule. Only snaffle bits having the following features are approved for use in Classes specifying the use of snaffle bits. Snaffle bits shall be composed of:

- Metal; or
- Metal and rubber (flexible rubber bits F1163);
- Metal and synthetic material.

Snaffle bits made only of metal must meet the following:

- All parts of the bit coming into the horse's mouth must be of metal (not necessarily the same metal);
- The diameter of the mouthpiece of both the snaffle bit must be such so as not to hurt the horse;
- Mouthpieces may be the same thickness or tapered towards the centre or central joints;
- All parts coming into the horse's mouth shall be rounded, smooth and not rigid, sharp or corrugated.

Keeping with the definition above, also permitted:

- Half-moon - port-mouth – curved;
- Rubber or synthetic bit - both jointed and unjointed;
- Sweet iron bit.

EXHIBIT NUMBERS

Exhibit Numbers will be supplied at the Horse Section Office, on the following basis:

- Breastplate numbers: for horses Exhibited in Breed, Saddle, Miscellaneous and Harness Classes. Each horse must carry the same breastplate number in all events it contests in those Classes. Must be around the horse's neck or in a number holder, not on the handler.
- Armband numbers: for riders entered in Riding Exhibitions, each rider will carry the same armband number in each event he or she contests in these competitions & displayed on the left arm.

On all occasions, the Exhibit Numbers (breastplate number, armband number) must be affixed to each horse or rider before arrival at the Marshalling Area preparatory to entering the ring. It is the responsibility of each Exhibitor and Competitor to ensure that the correct Exhibit number (Catalogue number) is carried by the horse or rider. Horses exhibiting with the incorrect catalogue number may be disqualified. All Breastplate numbers must be worn around the horse's neck, not on the handler. Harness exhibitor Numbers are to be displayed on the back of the vehicle.

EXHIBITOR CONFIRMATION ADVICE

Confirmation of acceptance will be emailed by 30th November 2021. **No** refunds of Entry Fees will be made after this confirmation of acceptance has been emailed.

Exhibitors: Please note that you need to print out your email (bench slip) as you will require your exhibitor Confirmation Advice (bench slip) to be allowed access to the grounds.

A new dashboard slip will also be issued with the size of your vehicle/s paid parking & powered or unpowered site. Anyone caught connected to power that hasn't paid will be removed from the ground & unable to compete. The Showtime Authorised Contact Person's name and mobile phone number will be written on the dashboard slip.

Dashboard slips must **always** be displayed on the dashboard of your vehicle whilst on the Showground. You must bring your bench slip to check in at the Horse Office upon arrival and present to the Horse Measurer's bay for Exhibit identification. Exhibits must be on the Showground to complete check-in.

EXHIBITOR PASSES/GATE PASSES

Passes will be allocated to exhibitors as follows:

- | | |

Exhibitors in Riding Classes will be allocated one (1) pass per day of Competition if exhibiting a horse in Hacks or Breeds.

No additional tickets will be allocated.

EXHIBITOR RECORD AND TAX INVOICE

For the Exhibitor's record, a copy of each Application for Entry or online confirmation report should be retained.

Upon receipt of payment by the RNCAS, the online Application for Entry becomes a tax invoice, and for online Applications for Entry, a confirmation email and a tax invoice will be issued upon request.

EXHIBITS - WELFARE

The RNCAS reserves the right in its absolute discretion to take such action as a Veterinary Surgeon may advise in relation to any animate Exhibit including without limitation;

- Administration of any drug or form of treatment (including surgical treatment);
- Removal of the Exhibit from any location to another location (in or out of the Showground);
- Destruction of the Exhibit;
- Or to require the exhibitor of the Exhibit to do so.

The Exhibitor of an Exhibit referred to in the above paragraph of this Regulation indemnifies the RNCAS in respect of all costs incurred by the RNCAS in connection with any action taken pursuant to that paragraph.

No mare or filly is to compete or take part in any ridden RNCAS Competition after day 120 of its pregnancy.

The RNCAS may at any time request that the Exhibitor of any Exhibit provide documentary evidence that the Exhibit has been vaccinated against any nominated viral disease.

HELMETS:

All Persons riding a horse must wear approved safety helmets to the current Australian, European, British or American Standard whilst mounted including but not limited to competition and exercise arenas (unless otherwise specified).

The restraining helmet harness must always be secured and fastened.

Only helmets bearing one or more of the standards below are accepted:

It is the Exhibitor's responsibility to ensure they are wearing the correct helmet. However, should the RNCAS deem the helmet worn is not of appropriate standard, or the Exhibitor is not wearing a helmet, the Exhibitor will be asked to dismount immediately.

TOP HATS ARE NOT ACCEPTABLE, including Side saddle Classes

Velcro: Velcro or similar materials are forbidden to be used as a riding aid. Any persons found using these materials may be disqualified from a Class in which it is exhibited, by the Chief Steward.

- Current Australian standard AS/NZS 3838 (2006 onwards) provided they are SAI Global marked
- New Australian standard ARB HS 2012 provided they are SAI Global marked.
- Current American standards ASTM F1163 (2004a or 04a onwards) provided they are SEI marked, or SNELL E2001.
- Current British standard PAS 015 (1998 or 2011) provided they are BSI Kitemarked.

- Interim European Standard VG1 (01.040: 2014-12) with or without BSI Kitemark.

Juniors (17 years and under) driving or riding in a carriage in Harness Classes are required to wear an approved safety helmet meeting the standards specified above.

FEES - ENTRY

Entry fees must be paid in full at the time of entry.

FEES - NOMINATIONS FEES, ACCEPTANCE FEES, ENTRY FEES, AND ADMINISTRATION FEES

Breeds, Hacks, Harness, Leading Rein, Riding, All entries need to be accompanied by full Entry Fee payment by the closing date of entries, 29th October 2021.

An Administration Fee of \$15 will be retained per entry per class by the RNCAS for entries not accepted into the competition.

The remainder of the Entry Fee will be refunded to the Exhibitor.

Despite any other Special Regulation, the Committee may from time to time and in its absolute discretion:

- Determine that a fee is payable in connection with any occurrence or circumstance;
- Waive, in whole or in part, any fee payable pursuant to those Special Regulations;
- Amend any fee payable.

Non-payment of any money payable pursuant to these Special Regulations will automatically disqualify the Exhibitor and the horse in question from Exhibition at any Show.

FIRE REGULATIONS

No Smoking in Horse Stalls or Pavilions. Primus stoves or naked lights are not permitted in Horse Stalls or Pavilions.

GRAND PARADES

All horses on grounds **MUST** be shown in the grand parade. Mounted horses may be led under special circumstances provided a member of the Horse Committee approves this request. Stallions are exempt from the Grand Parade.

Grand Parade Attire

- The attire worn in competitive classes is the standard attire for the Grand Parade;
- Hats must be worn in Grand Parade while leading an Exhibit;
- Grand Parade is Saturday at 5pm.

Stallions and Colts are not permitted in the Grand Parade.

Exemptions from Grand Parade

Unless granted an exemption, each competitor and each Exhibit on the Showground, including those with day stables, must parade in the Grand Parades held during the Show. It is the responsibility of each Exhibitor to ensure each Exhibit has a competent handler/ leader, rider or driver and the failure to provide one will not be considered as grounds for an exemption.

Stallions and Colts are not permitted in any Grand Parades.

All horses in the Grand Parade must be in charge by a competent handler who is over 8 years of age and accepted and competing in Competition Classes and must be properly controlled, with a suitable restraining bit in their mouth. The Exhibitor of any Exhibit which

breaches this Regulation will be liable, at the sole discretion of the Committee, to disqualification from the Show, the forfeiture of any prizes, prize money or trophies won, and a Penalty of \$150.

IDENTIFICATION OF EXHIBITS

All horses entered in competitive classes must be microchipped and have that chip recorded with a recognised National Registry.

All horses entered in competitive classes must be presented to the Official Measurer on the Showground for identification prior to competing in the classes in which they are entered.

Registration papers and microchip registration certificates must be presented at this time, so that the animal can be identified prior to competing.

If the microchip number provided at the time of entry does not match to the Exhibit when scanned, the Exhibit may be ineligible to compete.

INCORRECT AND INCOMPLETE APPLICATIONS FOR ENTRY

A correction fee of \$25 will be charged by the RNCAS, at its discretion, for each Application for Entry which is incorrect or incomplete.

If an application for entry is not rectified in accordance with RNCAS' requirements, the entry may not be accepted by the RNCAS.

JUDGING

The Society accepts no responsibility if the judging time happens to conflict with one or more classes or events. The Ringmaster or Assistant Ringmasters decision is final in the judging timetable.

The Judge's decision is final.

Champions and Reserve Champions: First prize winners only are eligible for judging of Champion. Reserve Champions will be selected from remaining first prize winners and the second prize winner from the class that provided the champion.

Substitute Judge

The Committee reserves the right to substitute a Judge.

LEADING REIN/FANCY DRESS

Ponies which are to be ridden in Leading Rein/Fancy Dress Classes must have been accepted for and competing in a Class or Classes for Breed or Hacks at the 2022 Royal Canberra Show.

Armbands to be worn for this Class.

LIABILITY FOR EXHIBITS

The Society shall not be responsible for the loss of or for any damage or injury occasioned to any Exhibit or the property of any Exhibitor from any cause whatsoever.

MARSHALLING

Exhibitors and Competitors shall be present in the marshalling yard and be ready to be judged at least 15 minutes prior to the time specified in the timetable for judging of the event.

Three calls only will be made to the marshalling yard - two warning calls then the final call.

Late Competitors and Exhibits will only be allowed to enter the arena at the Chief Horse Steward's discretion.

Ridden Classes Rider only and Led Classes Handler only will be permitted in the Marshalling Area.

No Exhibitor or Attendant will be permitted to enter the Marshalling Area unless his or her horse has affixed to it an Exhibit Number and is required to enter the ring to compete in a Class or event or during designated practice times.

A Competitor in riding events will be permitted to enter the Marshalling Area if he or she is mounted, has an armband number affixed and is required in the ring to compete in an event.

MEASURING/ IDENTIFICATION

ALL horses entered in the 2022 Royal Canberra Show must be presented to be identified by the Official Measurer before competing. **EA & Show Horse Council current & life measuring certificates will be accepted on presentation of Animal to be identified.** When presenting your horse, please have a current copy of relevant breed/registration papers and the breastplate number. Horses competing in height restricted Classes must be measured. Horses will not be measured unless the breastplate number is produced to the Official Measurer. Any Exhibitor who by himself/herself or any agent:

- directly or indirectly presents a horse which has an identity other than its true identity,
- does any act or thing which is likely to result in a horse being incorrectly identified,
- does any act or thing which is likely to result in a horse being incorrectly measured, or
- Presents a horse for measuring when the horse has had any Prohibited Substance administered to it is automatically disqualified from Exhibiting in any Class at the Show.

MEASURING

The RNCAS may, in its discretion and without assigning any reason, refuse to measure any horse presented for measuring if, in its opinion, the horse is not in a fit or proper condition to be measured or, in its opinion, any circumstances exist which are likely to lead to the horse being incorrectly measured.

The RNCAS may in its discretion request that a horse is swabbed. Any amendment to the height appearing on the breastplate number may only be made by the Official Measurer.

When measuring a horse, an allowance of up to 1 cm or 3/8 inch may be made for shoes.

A horse will only be measured once.

A horse will be transferred to another Class if it is determined by the Official Measurer to be over or under height for the Class for which it has been entered.

Horses presented for measuring at the measuring box must be suitably bitted.

A horse presented for measuring will be allowed a maximum of fifteen (15) minutes in the measuring box before being measured. Should the Exhibitor request a further period before being measured, one further period of fifteen (15) minutes maximum will be permitted later. At the conclusion of this second period of measure the horse's breastplate number will be stamped with the horse's height as determined by the Official Measurer.

MEASURING TIMES

Registration papers (hard copy) of each Exhibit must be produced for identification purposes at the time of measuring.

MISREPRESENTATION OF EXHIBITS

Proved wilful misrepresentation of Exhibits will not merely forfeit the prize but render the Exhibitor liable to be disqualified from Exhibiting at future Shows of the Society. The onus of proof as to the bona fides will rest upon the Exhibitor.

NOMINATIONS AND ENTRIES

All Applications for Entry of an Exhibit must be completed online and paid in full to be accepted as an entry.

An application for entry must be completed in its entirety;

No Entry will be accepted if the Application for Entry, whether duly completed, is received after midnight, 29th October 2021.

No animal (including Dogs) other than an Exhibit shall be brought on to the Showground by any Person except with the consent of the Chief Horse Steward

NON-ATTENDANCE OF WHOLE SHOW - ABSENT PENALTY:

Exhibitors who do not withdraw prior to the commencement of the Show for non-attendance by 10th February 2022 will be fined \$100 per animal, official withdrawals forms are available on the website. If animal is attending the show by 7 am on the day on which the first Class is scheduled otherwise must pay an Absent Penalty of \$100 for each Exhibit or Exhibitor does not present in each event for which the horse or rider has been nominated.

Withdrawals received prior to COB 13th December 2021 on the withdrawal form may be eligible for a refund of Entry Fees (less an administration fee of \$15 will be retained per entry per Class). The refund will be at the discretion of the Horse Committee upon notification. No Entry Fee refunds will be issued for withdrawals received after this date. Withdrawals received after 13th December 2021 & prior to COB Friday 31st January 2022 may be eligible for a refund of stabling & camping fees paid only (No refund of Entry Fees and an admin fee of \$25 will be retained). No refunds for any camping or stabling fees will be issued after COB 31st January 2022. All withdrawals are to be made on an official Withdrawal Form available from the web site.

NON-EXHIBITION OF ANIMALS

Every horse entered and not withdrawn by 10th February 2022 must be Exhibited unless a Withdrawal Form signed by the Exhibitor or his/her authorised agent is lodged with the Society 24 hours before the time of the relevant class stating that the animal is unable to compete. Failure to do so will incur a penalty of \$100 per Exhibit and per class.

NOVICE CLASSES

If you win a **NOVICE CLASS** at a Royal prior to the 2021 Royal Canberra Show, it is the Exhibitor's responsibility to officially withdraw from the Novice Class entered, or transfer into an Open Class, if not already entered.

If a horse has won an Open/ Child's /Adult /Lady /Gent /Mare/Gelding Class at a State Royal Show it is no longer considered a Novice. An Exhibit that has qualified to compete in an Open Championship Class at another State Royal is ineligible to compete in a Novice Class at Canberra Royal.

NUMBERING OF EXHIBITS

Numbers corresponding to the number in the catalogue must be worn by each Exhibit when appearing before the Judge. Exhibit numbers must be collected from the Horse Ring Secretary's office.

Exhibit numbers, in the form of a breastplate number, must be worn by all Exhibits on the Exhibit around the neck, or in the case of an Exhibit in a horse drawn vehicle, on the vehicle in a prominent and visible place. Numbers are assigned to individual Exhibits; different numbers are required for riding class. It is the responsibility of the Exhibitor to ensure that the correct breastplate number is displayed for a class.

Ring stewards will ensure that all Exhibits paraded before the Judge are eligible to compete in the class and are wearing the number shown in the official catalogue and class card. Exhibits not recorded in the official catalogue or class card will not be judged. If the name is not listed in the catalogue, the Ring Secretary will verify the entry. All class transfers must retain the relevant transfer paperwork in the breast plate behind your breast plate number. Breastplate numbers to be displayed in the breastplate holder.

OFFENSIVE BEHAVIOUR

All persons causing annoyance by making loud comments, or by other offensive behaviour, on the decisions of Judges, Stewards or other officials, or using swearing or foul language will after being cautioned by the Board, CEO or other such authorised representative, be expelled from the ground and, if a competitor, be liable for disqualification and forfeiture of any prize money won.

The Chief Ring Steward or Delegate will deal with offensive behaviour in the Ring.

OFF THE TRACK CLASSES OTT

The event is open to all Thoroughbreds that have officially raced or trialled either locally, nationally or internationally. All horses are required to be 3 years of age and over & over 14.2hh. Horses must have a Life No\be registered with a recognised studbook. Racing name to be used when entering Off the Track (OTT).

OWNERSHIP OF EXHIBITS

The Exhibitor is responsible for the care and control of the Exhibit on the Showground and compliance with the RNCAS Rules and Regulation.

If the legal owner of the Exhibit is different to the Exhibitor, the legal owner/s must be listed on the application for entry ('the Owner').

The Owners may be jointly responsible for the care and control of the animal and be brought into Disciplinary Proceedings at the RNCAS' discretion.

If an Exhibit is sold after the entry has been made, the RNCAS must be notified in writing with a payment of \$55. The seller or the purchaser may make the notification, no later than 14 days before the date of

Exhibition. If no notification is made and/ or alteration not paid for, the Exhibit may be disqualified from all classes and no refunds of any fees pertaining to that Exhibit will be made.

PERFORMANCE

Competitors are asked to submit their best performances for Novice, Open classes, from 1st October 2018 to 29th October 2021, close of entries. No Performances required for Breed classes. **With the cancellation of multiple shows due to COVID-19 over the past 18 months, a set number of performances has not been stipulated for the 2022 event. The committee are aware the opportunity to qualify has been limited and the RNCAS Horse committee will take this into consideration when considering acceptance to the show.** The Committee may from time to time in its absolute discretion impose such performance requirements as it considers appropriate. Recognised Performance Shows; Agricultural Society, Equestrian Australia, Show Horse Council of Australasia, Breed events. From the Information contained on the Performance Form the Society will, at its discretion, determine which entries are to be accepted.

N.B. No performances are required for the Breed classes, Thoroughbred, Off the Track, Standardbred classes and Riding Classes.

PERPETUAL TROPHIES

Perpetual Trophies remain the property of the RNCAS. Ownership of the Trophy does not pass to the winning Exhibitor. The winner's name will be engraved on the Trophy.

PRIZE RIBBONS

Ribbons and rosettes may be awarded based on the number of competitors in the Class on the day of Competition in accordance with the following table;

PRIZE MONEY

All prize money will be paid by the RNCAS via Electronic Funds Transfer by 31st March 2022. Exhibitors must supply a valid BSB and bank account number at the time of submitting their entries via the online entry system. Should an Exhibitor not submit valid banking details all monies will be forfeited.

All Exhibitors agree to the RNCAS deducting from their prize money any outstanding balances owing to the RNCAS including but not limited to; stabling & cleaning costs, membership fees or campsite charges.

Due to unforeseen circumstances, if a sponsor is not forthcoming for classes in which the prize money is sponsored, prize money will not be paid by the RNCAS at the amount that is printed in the relevant section of the schedule.

1st Prize money will be paid for classes with five (5) or more entries competing in the event unless specified. 2nd place prize money will be paid for (8) or more entries.

PRIZE MONEY AND GST

The Australian Taxation Office has deemed that GST is payable on prizes if an Exhibitor is registered for GST and enters an Exhibit as part of a business enterprise.

The information an exhibitor provides on the Application for Entry determines whether GST is applicable.

Any prize stated in this Schedule does not include GST. GST will not apply:

- If an Exhibitor enters an Exhibit as a hobby or private recreational pursuit; or
- If an Exhibitor enters an Exhibit as part of a business enterprise, the exhibitor has an ABN, but the exhibitor is NOT REGISTERED for GST.
- If an Exhibitor enters an Exhibit as part of a business enterprise, the exhibitor is not entitled to an ABN as the business or enterprise is not operating in Australia.

GST will apply:

- If an Exhibitor enters an Exhibit as part of a business enterprise, the exhibitor has an ABN, and the exhibitor is REGISTERED for GST.

Where GST applies, the RNCAS will pay the prize money quoted in this Schedule plus 10% GST. The RNCAS will issue a recipient created tax invoice.

WARNING: The Exhibitor must complete the Tax Details on the Application for Entry. Failure to do so will result in the RNCAS deducting 47% of the successful exhibitor's prize money as Pay as You Go Tax (PAYG). The RNCAS recommends that the Exhibitor seeks professional advice before completing the Tax Details.

PROHIBITION OF MULTIPLE EXHIBITS

No Rider, Handler or Exhibitor may parade or ride more than one Exhibit in any one Class (unless otherwise specified in Sectional Conditions or determined by the Horse Committee).

PROTESTS

All Protests must be delivered to the Ring Secretary's Office no later than 30 minutes after the event, after which no Protest will be entertained. Each Protest must be in writing and accompanied by a fee of \$300.00, which will be forfeited at the discretion of the Chief Ring Steward or other such authorised representative if they consider the Protest frivolous. Protests will be dealt with by the Horse Committee as soon as practicable after the receipt thereof.

The protest shall be determined by the Horse Committee Disputes Committee. Their decision shall be final and binding. No reasons for the decision shall be required.

RED COATS/STEWARDS

During Shows conducted by the RNCAS, the failure of an Exhibitor to comply with directives issued by a Red Coat escorting Classes into or out of the Arena, or Horse Section (Ring or Marshalling Steward) Official shall automatically render the Exhibitor involved, liable for disqualification and for non-acceptance of entry at future Royal Canberra Shows.

REFUNDS

No refund of entry fees will be made after acceptances have been **issued** by RNCAS on 30th November 2021. No refund of any fees, stabling or camping fees will be made after 31st January 2022

REPLACEMENT OF AN EXHIBIT

The replacement of an Exhibit entered in a Class, with a substitute Exhibit is NOT permitted (including Riding Classes).

RESTRAINING BITS

All Stallions and Colts one year old and over presented into the ring for led Classes must be in charge of a competent handler, over 17 years of age and must be properly controlled, with a suitable restraining bit in their mouth and wearing headgear of proper strength and quality which is in use.

A suitable restraining bit or a show halter (which must have a throat lash; Welsh exempted) is acceptable for Mares, Fillies and Geldings.

The following Breed Associations are permitted to be shown in Classes restricted to that breed other than with a restraining bit; all the other conditions included in this Regulation being applicable: The Australian Miniature Pony Society Inc. & Miniature Horse Society.

RIDING COMPETITIONS

Riding Competitors must ride an Exhibit that has been accepted for and competing in a Class or Classes for Breed or Hack events at the 2022 Canberra Royal Show. Heavy Horses cannot be used as a mount in Riding Classes.

MOUNTED TURNOUT – see Annexure A

RIDING, HACK & SHOW HUNTER CLASSES – AGE RESTRICTIONS

All Exhibits in ridden Pony Hack Classes, Breed Classes, Show Hunter, Riding Classes n.e12.2 hands must be ridden by a Rider under 17 yrs.

All Exhibits in ridden Pony Hack Classes, Breed Classes, Show Hunter, Riding Classes over 12.2 hands and n.e. 14 hands may be ridden by adults or children (adults must be suitably mounted for size of pony or rider)

All Exhibits in ridden Galloway Classes, Breed Classes, Show Hunter, Riding Classes over 14 hands and n.e.15 hands must be ridden by a Rider 9 years and over, unless otherwise stated.

All Exhibits over 15 hands in Hack Classes, breed Classes, Show Hunter, Working Show Hunter or Riding Classes must be ridden by a Rider 12 years and over.

RINGMASTER

The word **Ringmaster** includes the Ringmaster, any Deputy or Assistant Ringmaster and any Person for the time being exercising some or all the functions of the Ringmaster.

A determination by the Ringmaster on any question or dispute arising in or incidental to the conduct of the ring or the conduct of any Competition, Parade, Exhibition or Event or as to the action of any Exhibit or Exhibitor or Competitor or as to the proper description of anything whether animate or inanimate shall be final and binding upon all Exhibitors.

SCHEDULE CONDITIONS

Conditions printed in the Schedule relative of Class breed or group of classes will be observed.

SCORE SHEETS

It is the absolute discretion of the Judge and the Chair of the Horse Committee as to whether Scoresheets are posted at the completion of a Class.

SPECIAL HORSE REGULATION

If there is any inconsistency between Special Horse Regulations and any provision appearing hereafter in this Schedule, the applicable provision(s) of Special Horse Regulations will prevail.

SPONSORSHIP PRIZES

Prizes are provided by third parties and the RNCAS advises that any such prizes may be subject to change

or amendment occurring at any time, thereby making the original information published incorrect.

RNCAS will not be held responsible for a Sponsor or third party failing to honour their agreement.

STABLING

The RNCAS will allocate stables to each Exhibitor according to the number and composition of the exhibitor's Exhibit(s).

An Exhibitor will be taken to have vacated and to not require a stable that has been allocated to that exhibitor if, by 8am on the day of allocation, the stable has not been occupied by an Exhibit.

No Exhibitor has any right to use or occupy any stable or portion of the Showground not allocated to him/her from time to time by the RNCAS and shall forthwith vacate same upon being requested so to do by any Official of the RNCAS.

Any horse found in a stable not allocated to such horse shall if so, required by any Official of the RNCAS be immediately removed from the Showground and shall not again enter the Showground except with the written consent of the Chairman of the Committee.

Stables are to be used for the stabling of horses only. No exhibitor has any right to use or occupy any stable for any other purpose, such as accommodation, storage of fodder, bedding or tack. Any Exhibitor acting in breach of this Regulation will be fined a Penalty of \$200 for each stable per day and may, at the discretion of the Committee, be disqualified from competing at the then current Show. In such an event any Award that the Exhibitor may have won at that Show is also forfeited.

Exhibitors residing within a 100 km radius of the Showground are unlikely to be provided with stables in the initial allocation, but every endeavour will be made to accommodate these nominations should withdrawals permit.

For each Exhibit that has been allocated a stable, a Stable Bond Cleaning fee of \$100 per stable applies. If you fail to fully clean your stable out on departure, the nominated credit card will be charged.

No horse(s) may be brought onto the grounds that are not competing at the 2022 Royal Canberra Show. Subject to all your stables being left in a satisfactory condition and the tack room lock being intact - for broken or damaged stable panels or canvas screens, a fee of \$50 will be deducted from the stable deposit.

- Any Exhibitor acting in breach of the Special Horse regulations may, at the discretion of the Committee, be disqualified from competing at the then current Show. In such an event any Award/prize money that the Exhibitor may have won at that Show is also forfeited.
- Exhibitors must provide their own feed & water bins and shavings for horses stabled on the Showground. Shaving are ordered on-line prior to the Show.

Stabling will be allocated according to availability. The Stabling Manager is the reference point for stabling of multiple Exhibits from different Exhibitors together where possible. This list must be provided by the COB 29th October 2021 via email with the list of Exhibitors to be stabled together (where possible) to horse@rncas.org.au

STABLE ALLOCATION

Stabling is from 6.30am on the nominated arrival day and you must vacate your stable(s) by **6.00** am on the nominated departure day. Anyone leaving Sunday during the day will have a vacate date of Monday morning, otherwise, you will be locked out Sunday morning.

Stables must be fully cleaned out for the next Exhibitor's arrival or the stable cleaning fee will be debited. Stables need to be checked off by staff by presenting your Breastplate Number at the office. Staff will sign off on your cleaned stable.

A stable cleaning fee of \$100: your card will not be debited unless you fail to clean your stable out fully – stables will be inspected on departure.

Stable Fees will be payable upon notification by the RNCAS. Fees include GST.

Notification of stable allocations will be emailed to Exhibitors by 30th November 2021.

Please note that stabling is **NOT GUARANTEED**, and allocation is at the discretion of the Horse Committee.

STAINING OR COLOURING

Staining or colouring of hair or skin, or excessive makeup on any Exhibit is not permitted, and any such Exhibit may be disqualified by the Chief Steward, from a Class in which it is exhibited.

STALLIONS AND COLTS

Stallions/Colts entering the arena must be under the control of an experienced handler, rider or driver, 18yrs or over, except for Shetland ponies.

Stallions are only eligible to compete in Harness Turnout Classes and Classes for Driven Stallions.

All Stallions or Colts 1 year and over competing in led Classes **MUST** be shown in a bit.

Stallions and colts may only compete in Classes where specifically permitted.

Stallions are **not** eligible to compete in Classes other than those specially provided for entries. Stallions competing in a Stud Class must parade in a customary manner.

Stallions and colts are **not** permitted in Grand Parades. All stallions and colts, while on the grounds & in all Horse Competitions must always be clearly identified with green identification on bridles/winkers, including stables, floats and trucks.

SUITABLE ATTIRE

When in the ring, Attendants must be suitably attired. Closed in footwear, no joggers. Hats must be worn, NO baseball caps permitted. Riding helmet to Standard must be worn when mounted at any time. Long sleeve shirt or Jacket. A Person not suitably attired is not permitted to compete in a Class or appear in a Grand Parade.

When in the Grand Parade, Attendants must wear the same attire or substantially similar attire, as was worn by Attendants in the ring in which the Exhibit of which they are in charge was Exhibited. All Grand Parade Attendants must wear a hat.

All Attendants of led horses in Grand Parades may wear RNCAS dust coats in lieu of coats/waistcoat.

No long boots or gaiters to be worn by Riders under 18 years competing in riding classes.

SWAPPING MOUNTS

Swapping mounts in the Main Arena is not permitted. Riders must request with the Ringmaster or Assistant Ringmaster or Stewards to leave the Arena to swap mounts. An exception may be granted by the Ringmaster/Assistant Ringmaster/Steward in a Championship Class where a rider may have more than one mount in the Class. One horse one rider in a class to remain.

TESTS AND SWABBING

A Swabbing levy per horse applies to all entries.

The Chief Steward or other such authorised representative may make or cause to be made any test of any Exhibit to determine whether any drug or stimulant has been administered to such Exhibit for any of the following purposes and detain such horse for such period as is deemed necessary. A compulsory drug testing levy per horse will apply. It is the intention of these regulations that all animals shall perform on their merits without the aid of drugs which will affect the conduct, performance or appearance of the animal.

An Exhibitor shall not administer and shall procure that there shall not be administered to his Exhibit any drug or substance herein call "a prohibited drug". Prohibited drugs are substances originating externally whether or not they are endogenous to the animal and means any performance or behaviour of an animal by its action upon the central or peripheral nervous system, the cardiovascular system, the respiratory system, the alimentary digestive system, the musculoskeletal system or the urogenital system and shall include analgesics, anti-histamines, anti-inflammatory agents, blood coagulants, diuretics, hormones and their synthetic counterparts, cortico-steroids, anabolic steroids, local anaesthetics, muscle relaxants and tranquillisers and vitamins. The use of antibiotic substances (anti-viral, anti-microbial, or anti-parasitic) except for Procaine Penicillin may be permitted.

The Society may at its discretion cause an examination to be made of an Exhibit by a Veterinary Officer who in the course of such examination may make by such methods as he may determine such tests and take such samples from such Exhibit as he deems necessary or advisable. The result of such examination shall be reported to the Society.

An Exhibit to which, in the opinion of a Veterinary Officer, a prohibited drug has been administered shall not be exhibited without consent of the Society and shall be removed from the Showground forthwith upon notice from the Society.

The Society may in its sole discretion and in the light of all information made available to it disallow or cancel the entry and any award made to the Exhibit, without in such case being called upon to give any reason, therefore.

The owner or any other person who oversaw an animal to which a prohibited drug has been administered may be disqualified or otherwise penalised by the Society. Any person who at any time administers or causes to be administered for the purpose of affecting the performance of an animal in any event or class at the Show any drug as defined above or has in his possession any improper contrivance may be disqualified or otherwise penalised by the Society. Particular attention will be paid to the detection of sedative and tranquilliser groups of drugs but analysis for all classes of prohibited substances will be included. The collection of samples inter alia will always involve taking urine and/or blood.

An examination may include an examination for desensitised limbs. Any animal found to have a limb or part of a limb desensitised by any means will be considered to have competed under the influence of a prohibited substance and penalised accordingly.

The owner or his representative may be present during testing but shall not interfere in any way with the conduct of the test and will observe the instructions of the veterinary officer on duty. In the absence of the Exhibitor and/or owner the Society recognises the rider, and/or handler and/or driver as the authorised agent of the Exhibitor.

The Society and any servant or appointee of the Society shall not be liable to the Exhibitor, owner or other interested parties, for the death of, or for any injury, damage or infection which may be sustained by an Exhibit occasioned by or arising out of any act or omission of any servant, agent or appointee of the Society done or committed in the course of his examination whether due to the negligence of any such servant, agent or appointee or otherwise.

Any Exhibit which has been brought to the Showgrounds and is found by the Chief Steward or other such authorised representative to have had administered a drug as defined above, the owner and any person who is in charge of the horse may be disqualified or otherwise penalised by the Society. Any person who at any time administers or causes to be administered for the purpose of affecting the performance of a horse in any event or class at the Show any drug defined above, or improper contrivance may be disqualified or otherwise penalised by the Society.

TIME OF ARRIVAL

All Exhibits are to be on the ground no later than when specified in the schedule. No entry to the Showgrounds before Monday 1.00pm 21st February 2022.

TIMETABLE OF JUDGING

A timetable of judging of all Classes and events will be available to all Exhibitors on the Royal Canberra Show web site as soon as possible.

This judging timetable is subject to change at any time. The RNCAS accepts no responsibility if judging times conflict with one or more Classes or events in which an Exhibitor may be entered.

Where conflict does occur, it is the responsibility of the Exhibitor to notify withdrawal from either event.

TRANSFER & RE-CLASSIFICATION

Should a horse be found by the Official Measurer to be over or under the height stipulated for the class in which it has been entered, the owner may lodge an application

in writing on the form provided with the Ring Secretary to have the entry transferred to a corresponding horse class in which the Exhibit is eligible to compete.

Should a horse ceases to be eligible to compete in the class or classes entered for any reason other than height, an application for transfer or re-classification may be made in writing to the Ring Secretary for decision by the Chief Horse Steward or Deputy on duty.

Should the eligibility of a horse to compete in a class in which an entry has been accepted, be questioned prior to the judging of the class the Ring Secretary and/or Ring Steward will so advise the Chief Horse Steward or his Deputy on duty before the judging of the class is completed.

Judges and Ring Stewards are not authorised to consider applications for transfer or reclassification or to make any additions or alterations to the information contained on official class cards.

TRANSPORT

Horse transports will not be permitted to leave Exhibition Park until after the Grand Parade on Saturday unless an exemption form has been obtained from the Chief Horse Steward.

VEHICLE PERMIT

Every vehicle entering the Showgrounds will require a vehicle permit. Campers will be issued with vehicle permits as part of their camping fee. UNAUTHORISED PARKING WILL BE POLICED & UNAUTHORISED VEHICLES REMOVED FROM THE GROUND.

WEARING OF ARMBAND NUMBERS & BREASTPLATE NUMBERS

Every rider whilst in the Ring for the purpose of competition or parading in any riding exhibition must wear an armband number which will be provided by the RNCAS and which must bear the certified number allocated to the rider in the Class in which the Exhibit is for the time being competing or parading. This number must be in an approved armband holder and should be worn on the left arm. Application for entry in a riding Competition shall be deemed an application for an armband number.

Every Exhibit whilst in the ring and being Exhibited for the purpose of Competition or parading in any Breed, Saddle and Miscellaneous Class must wear a breastplate number which will be provided by the RNCAS and which must bear the certified number allocated to the Exhibit in the Class in which the Exhibit is for the time being competing or parading. The breastplate number must be worn on the front by each Exhibit. Each application for entry in a Breed, Saddle and Miscellaneous Class shall be deemed an application for a breastplate number. The breastplate number is issued by the RNCAS and it is the Exhibitor's right to use it in the ring during the Show in respect of which it is issued.

Every Exhibitor's vehicle whilst in the ring and being exhibited for the purpose of competition or parading in any Light Harness, and

Business, Delivery & Turnout Class must wear a breastplate number which will be provided by the RNCAS and which must bear the certified number allocated to the Exhibitor in the Class in which the Exhibitor is for the time being competing or parading. The breastplate number must be conspicuously located on the back of each Exhibitor's vehicle. Each application for entry in a Light Harness, and Business, Delivery & Turnout Class shall be deemed an application for a breastplate number. The breastplate number is issued by the RNCAS and it is

the Exhibitor's right to use it in the ring during the Show in respect of which it is issued.

WORKPLACE SURVEILLANCE ACT

EPIC operates surveillance cameras from EPIC Head Office Security, and these are in and around facilities requiring security monitoring for the safety or security of individuals or property. RNCAS also has access to EPIC security cameras and vice versa. Please note that security camera monitoring is continuous and ongoing, and it is deemed that a person, by entering the Showground, consents to this photographing, filming or taping. RNCAS strictly complies with the Workplace Surveillance Act 2005.

WITHDRAWALS (Gents, Ladies and Childs Hack and Show Hunter Classes).

Entries are permitted in Gents, Ladies Hack and Show Hunter Classes. However, the Exhibit may only compete in one of the two Classes.

Transfers between these are not permitted. Exhibitors must confirm their intention to start in their chosen Class by 7.00am on the morning of the Class. Entry Fees will not be refunded.

Please note: If an Exhibit has won its Open Class, it is permitted to be withdrawn from Gents or Ladies Classes with no withdrawal penalty.

WITHDRAWALS

All withdrawals from Classes must be made in writing on the withdrawal form available online and can be sent via email to: horse@rncas.org.au. Prior to 10th of February 2022

Emailed withdrawals must include the following information;

- Exhibitor name, as per online entry if in joint names both names (if applicable);
- All Class or Class numbers withdrawn from;
- Horses Full name as per entry

No refund of entry fees will be made after acceptances have been issued by RNCAS. (Refer to the refund policy)

However, once the Show commences on Monday, 21st February 2022, withdrawals from Classes will only be accepted on the official RNCAS withdrawal form, available from the Ring Secretary's Office.

Withdrawals submitted at the office prior to 7 am on the day on which the Class is scheduled to take place will NOT attract a withdrawal fee.

No emails of withdrawal accepted after 10th February 2022.

ANNEXURE A – MOUNTED TURNOUT

HAIR and MAKEUP

- Hair to be worn in a neat, tidy style that sits above the collar of the jacket
- A fine hair net can be worn
- No visible hair pins
- Natural make-up
- Jewellery not allowed

HELMET

- An approved black velvet safety helmet to the current Australian, European or American standard
- Sits straight and forward on the head, just above the eyebrows
- Chin strap to be a firm fit under the chin

SHIRT

- White cotton and collarless with buttonholes on the front and back of the neck band to attach the stock
- Sleeves to be double cuffed with buttonholes for cufflinks

STOCK

- Made of white starched Marcella Swiss cotton, neatly tied (not ready tied)
- Knot to be square with the flaps each side
- Stock flaps may be pinned with small gold safety pins to the shirt or with ties around the body
- A plain gold stock pin should be visible above the vest and placed horizontally. It must pass through the stock and the shirt

STUDS

- Two gold studs must be placed through the stud holes of the shirt to hold the stock in place
- Back stud has a short shank with a blunt end
- Front stud has a longer shank

CUFF LINKS

- Plain gold
- Can be engraved with initials but no ornaments
- Any shape or size but should be neat and not too bulky
- Cufflinks to have a small chain to pass through the shirt and not a rigid bar

GLOVES

- Fawn or chamois shade
- String cotton back
- Fastened at the wrist with a small button with a worked loop or a button hole

WAISTCOAT

- Tattersall Check, consisting of one line black with an additional coloured line of personal choice
- Back of the waistcoat should be of the same fabric
- Hand-picked edging
- Neutral buttons
- Buttons above the waistline fastened
- Top of the vest is just visible over the jacket opening

RIDING COAT

- Black or navy blue pure wool Cavalry Twill
- Lining should be black, dark blue or dark grey
- Single vent. Lapel edges to be hand-picked
- Three small buttons and functional button

holes on each sleeve

- A lapel button hole should be in the right side of the jacket
- Buttons above the waistline to be fastened
- Length of the jacket should be level with the riders base knuckles (where fingers join hands) when the arms are down by the side
- Sleeve length to finish at the wrist when the rider's arm in the riding position
- A plain white handkerchief to be placed in the right pocket

BREECHES

- Pure woollen Cavalry Twill or English whipcord in shades of fawn or chamois
- Doe or suede skin knee strapping
- All visible stitching hand-picked
- Contain a side zip and not a front zip
- Contain an opening below the knee (centre front) with six neutral buttons and functional button holes 6. Three buttons to be visible above the boot
- Boot garter strap to sit between the second and third button

TOP BOOTS

- Black leather and thoroughly polished
- Sit into the angle of the knee when the knee is bent
- Fits well on both the leg and the foot
- Even height around the boot tops 5. Soles to be leather, stitched to the uppers and worn

BOOT GARTER STRAP

- Stitched black leather with a neutral colour backing
- Small buckle and keeper that must be identical to the spur strap buckle
- Buckle done up on the middle hole
- Buckle to sit in line with the buckle of the spur strap

SPURS

- Stainless steel and blunt with a round eye
- Offset with the long side on the outside of the boot
- Worn on the seam of the boot at the ankle and sits straight along seam
- Buckled on the middle hole

SPUR STRAPS

- Stitched black double leather with a black backing
- Identical to the boot garter strap except it has a black backing
- Buckled on middle hole
- When buckled they sit on top of the foot and slightly off center towards the outside of the boot
- Buckle must sit in line with the buckle of the boot garter strap

HACKING CANE

- Plain or plaited leather that matches the colour of the saddlery
- Carried one third of the way down from the top in the right hand Saddlery should be supple, good quality, well maintained, in immaculate condition, and most important, a correct fit.

SENIOR TURNOUT SADDLERY

- Saddlery should be supple, good quality, well maintained, in immaculate condition, and most important, a correct fit

BRIDLE

- Double bridle with correct fitting and placement of the buckles on the horse
- Bridle, saddle, mounts and hacking cane match in colour and complement the colour of the horse
- Stitching is fine and about 10-12 stitches to the inch
- All straps to be buckled in the middle hole
- Browband lies evenly below the ears without touching them and does not interfere with the hang of the headpiece
- Browband is flat leather and a width that suits the horse's profile
- Noseband sits about 1 inch or 2-3cm below the cheekbones
- Noseband fits two adult fingers when done up and should be firm but not too tight
- Noseband and browband must match and be flat leather
- Throat lash is a comfortable fit - allowing room for the horse to flex his/her throat
- Cheek piece buckles to be in line with the eye, three on the near side and two on the off side

BIT AND BRADOON

- Stainless steel
- Bridoon (snaffle) can be either ring or egg butt
- Curb bit is a moveable Weymouth or fixed at the sides
- Both bits should be a pair - if a sliding cheek bit is used, it must be accompanied by a loose ring bridoon and if a fixed cheek bit is used, it must be accompanied by an egg butt bridoon
- Bridoon lies in the horse's mouth and the curb bit immediately below it

LIP STRAP

- Lip strap and chain guard must be of the same leather as the bridle and fit the size of the bits
- Small strap is fitted to the left side of the bit and the longer strap fitted to the right side of the bit and passes through the ring on the bottom centre of the chain 3. Buckle to be done up on the near side

CURB CHAIN

- Sits on a leather chain guard that is the same leather as the lip strap
- Attached to the second link on both sides
- Links to be hooked neatly onto the hook and not left dangling

REINS

- Suitable length to suit the horse
- Both reins to be flat leather with the snaffle rein wider than the curb rein
- Bridoon (wider) rein is attached to the large ring of the bit
- Curb (thinner) rein is attached to the bottom small ring of the bit
- Buckles must face the off side

SADDLE

- Fits horse correctly well over the horses wither
- Suits the build and leg length of rider
- Skirt and saddle flaps all finely stitched, as should the three short girth points and girth buckle guards

GIRTH

- Three fold leather Fitzwilliam girth
- Matches the saddle in colour
- Done up on the middle holes if there is an uneven number of holes, or either of the two middle holes if there are an equal number of holes
- Done up on the same hole on either side. however do not forsake safety for the correct hole length; more points will be deducted for an unsafe saddle than for incorrect hole placement
- Open side of the fold faces towards the hindquarters of the horse
- Surcingle of the Fitzwilliam girth has stitched edging and does up on the middle girth point one hole lower on both sides
- Buckle guard covers buckles

STIRRUP LEATHERS

- Matches the saddle in colour 2. Stitched double leather, and when fitted, should be done up on the middle hole 3. Iron should be run up and down leathers with ease

STIRRUP IRONS

- Stainless steel without rubber treads
- Two metal bars under the boot must be rough, not smooth
- Offset irons are not acceptable

NUMBER HOLDER

- Matches the colour of the saddlery and stitched. Sits neatly on the horse's chest.

NUMNAH

- Lined sheepskin. Worn under the saddle
- Sits slightly larger than the saddle so that when in place it is slightly visible all around the saddle
- Sits up in the front arch of the saddle, not tight down on the horses wither
- Closely matches the saddle colour

Junior & Intermediate Turnout

HAIR

- Hair to be worn in a neat, tidy style that sits above the collar of the jacket
- A fine hair net can be worn. No visible hair pins.
- Natural make-up
- Jewellery is not allowed
- An approved velvet safety helmet to the current Australian, European or American standard Colour to match rider's jacket Sits straight and forward on the head, just above the eyebrows Chin strap to be a firm fit under the chin

HELMETS

- An approved velvet safety helmet to the current Australian, European or American standard Colour to match rider's jacket sits straight and forward on the head, just above the eyebrows Chin strap to be a firm fit under the chin

SHIRT

- Plain colour that blends with the jacket
- Cotton with a correctly fitting collar
- Sleeves should have double cuffs and have buttonholes on either side to take cufflinks

CUFFLINKS

- Plain gold. Can be engraved with initials but no ornaments
- Any shape or size but should be neat and not too bulky

- Cufflinks to have a small chain to pass through the shirt and not a rigid bar

and slightly off centre towards the outside of the boot

TIE AND TIE BAR

- Plain wool of a nice width and blending tones to the jacket
- It must be tied neatly and sit firmly into the collar of the shirt
- A plain gold bar or tie pin to be positioned between the knot and the V of the waistcoat. it is to pass through to the shirt to hold neatly in position

WAISTCOAT

- Pure wool in Tattersall Check as worn for senior turnouts or plain wool colour to match breeches.
- Hand stitched edging (hand-picked)
- Same fabric back and front
- Neutral tone buttons
- Top of the vest is just visible over the jacket opening
- The back of the waistcoat to sit over the top of the jodhpur's so the shirt cannot be seen

RIDING COAT

- Pure wool with the collar in the same fabric. Single vent
- Jacket lining should blend with the colour of the jacket
- Lapel edges to be hand-picked
- A plain white handkerchief to be in the right pocket
- Three small buttons on each sleeve with functional button holes
- Button hole in the right lapel of the jacket
- Three buttons and button holes down the front of the jacket, with the third button hole sitting on the waist line. All buttons are to be done up

JODHPURS

- Quality stretch fabric in an appropriate turnout colour.
- Self or suede strapping
- Long enough to sit neatly over the top of the riding boot when sitting mounted on the horse
- Bottom of the jodhpurs to have a cuff and a concealed zip on the outside leg
- All visible seems to be hand picked

JODHPUR BOOTS

- Dark brown quality leather with leather soles
- Soles must not be slippery so as children's feet do not slip out of the irons
- Sole must be stitched to the uppers, not glued
- Soles must be the correct foot size and fit firmly up the ankle with firm elastic

SPURS

- Stainless steel and blunt, with a round eye
- Spur faces down
- Fits closely to the boot and lay straight below the elastic at the side of the boot
- Spurs are optional for riders under 12 years and will not be penalised if not worn

SPUR STRAPS

- Brown double leather to match the boots
- Stitched with a small buckle which has a keeper
- Buckle done up on the middle hole
- When buckled they sit on top of the foot

2022 Guidelines for Performance

Closing Date for Entries

Friday 29th October 2021, midnight.

The performance Period will be:

1st October 2018 – 29th October 2021

(Acceptance will be allowed by the Horse Committee as they see fit due to COVID restrictions limiting the number of qualifying events for the 2022 event)

ALL ENTRIES & PERFORMANCES ARE TO BE SUBMITTED ONLINE

All horses entered must be microchipped at the time of entry. This is mandatory (except Standardbreds)

All horses entered must also be registered with a Breed Society recognised by the ROYAL NATIONAL CAPITAL AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY (refer to Schedule) or with EQUESTRIAN AUSTRALIA, or the SHOW HORSE COUNCIL OF AUSTRALASIA. Only horses entered in Business Delivery & Turnout Classes and Heavy Horse Classes are not required to be registered.

If results are incorrectly recorded (Name, date of Show, number in Class, Award gained, type of Class, Judge and Exhibitor), the performance may not be accepted.

First place, Reserve Champion, Champion or Supreme Champion winners from the 2018/2019/2020 Royal Shows or any other State Royal Shows within the performance period are not afforded automatic entry into Classes for future shows.

A "WIN" is considered as:

- First place, Champion or Reserve Champion in Open Classes at Agricultural Shows. An OPEN CLASS is one that does not restrict entrants. Examples of restricted Classes include Novice, Intermediate, showing Thoroughbred characteristics, Maiden, Local
- First, second, third and fourth placing in Open Classes at State Royal Shows, being Sydney, Melbourne, Brisbane, Canberra, Perth, Darwin, Adelaide and Hobart. Please note Bathurst, Geelong, Toowoomba, Launceston and Norfolk Island are considered Agricultural Shows, not State Royal Shows.
- First and second placing in a Novice Class at the previous Canberra Royal Horse Show will be considered as a win.
- Only one (1) Lady's, Gentleman's or Child's HACK OR SHOW HUNTER event win, may be included as part of your performance.
- For Show Hunters only, one (1) Working Show Hunter event win may be included as part of your performance.

If you win a **NOVICE CLASS** at a State Royal prior to the 2022 RNCAS Show, it is the Exhibitor's responsibility to officially withdraw from the Novice Class entered, or transfer into an Open Class, if they are not already entered. If a horse has won ANY Class, Open/ Child/Adult/Lady/Gent /Mare/Gelding Class at a State Royal Show it is no longer considered a Novice. If a Rider has won an Open or Novice Class at a State Royal Show, he or she will no longer be considered a Novice.

An Exhibit that has qualified to compete in an Open Championship Class at another State Royal Show will no longer be eligible to compete in a Novice Class at RNCAS.

ONLY ONE PERFORMANCE FROM EACH SHOW WILL COUNT (if you win your Open Class and then go on to win the Champion, only one will count as a win (including performances from Royal Shows)). Should you place first in a restricted (e.g. Novice, Intermediate, etc.) Class and go on to win the Champion or Reserve, the Champion or Reserve will be counted. Similarly, if you place second (in an Open or Restricted Class) and go on to gain Reserve Champion, the Reserve Champion will be counted as a win

SADDLE HORSES AND SHOW HUNTERS

AN EXHIBIT CAN ONLY BE ENTERED IN EITHER SADDLE HORSE CLASSES OR SHOW HUNTER CLASSES **BUT NOT BOTH.**

Competitors entering are asked to submit their best performances from 1st October 2018 to 29th October 2021, close of entries. With the cancellation of multiple shows due to COVID-19 over the past 18 months, the number of

required performances has not been stipulated for the 2022 event. The committee are aware the opportunity to qualify has been limited and the RNCAS Horse committee will take this into consideration when considering acceptance to the show.

LEADING REIN

Ponies which are to be ridden in Leading Rein must have been accepted for and competing in a Class or Classes for Breed or Hack events at the 2022 RNCAS.

BREED CLASSES

Competitors entering are asked to submit their best performances from 1st October 2018 to 29th October 2021, close of entries. With the cancellation of multiple shows due to COVID-19 over the past 18 months, the number of required performances has not been stipulated for the 2022 event. The committee are aware the opportunity to qualify has been limited and the RNCAS Horse committee will take this into consideration when considering acceptance to the show.

- No performances are required for Breed classes at the 2022 Royal Canberra Show
- Yearlings require no performances for the 2022 Royal Canberra Show.
- Broodmares do not require any performances and may transfer to dry Mare Classes only if they have the relevant performance.

WORKING AUSTRALIAN STOCK HORSE CLASSES

Competitors entering are asked to submit their best performances from 1st October 2018 to 29th October 2021, close of entries. With the cancellation of multiple shows due to COVID-19 over the past 18 months, the number of required performances has not been stipulated for the 2022 event. The committee are aware the opportunity to qualify has been limited and the RNCAS Horse committee will take this into consideration when considering acceptance to the show.

Only horses entered in Stock Horse Classes are eligible to enter Working Stock Horse Classes.

It is the Rider's responsibility to confirm that the mount nominated to be used in your Riding Class(es) must have been accepted for and competing in at least one Class for Breeds, Hack before it can be used as your Riding Class mount. If the horse nominated was not accepted in at least one Class, then you must contact the Horse Section to nominate a different horse, that you have confirmed with the Owner has been accepted and competing in at least one Class at the 2022 RNCAS Show, otherwise you must officially withdraw.

HARNESS CLASSES

Horses or Ponies entering in the Harness Classes are recommended to submit their best Harness performance at recognised Agricultural Shows or Harness Shows. These must be gained during the official performance period 1st October 2018 to 29th October 2021.

PLEASE NOTE:

For Agricultural Shows, which hold more than one (1) Annual Show, performances will be counted if they are listed in the Agricultural Societies Council of NSW's Show Dates Book or ASC website. For any Agricultural Show running supplementary shows, it is a requirement to have more than one month between these two shows.

Additional Annual Shows held interstate will be considered on an individual basis.
