Competition Rules and Guidelines

- In case of wet weather or scratchings call or text either Kelli SHAW 0438632952 or Linden Knight 0402284806.
- All participants must be members of the NSW Police Equestrian Club. This is an automatic fee on entry.
- All NSW Police Force (including volunteers in Policing) and full-time employees of government agencies with a law enforcement role, as well as full-time employees of NSW Fire & Rescue, Ambulance Service of NSW, Australian Border Force (Department of Immigration and Border Protection), Justice NSW, Australian Protective Services, NSW State Emergency Service, the Sheriff Department, NSW Rural Fire Service, Australian Federal Police (both NSW and ACT based, are invited to participate. Retired and family members from each of these agencies (including ACT) are also encouraged to take part.
- Australian Defence Force personnel (within NSW) are also permitted to participate and Nurses and Midwives Association of NSW.
- Competitors must be of or above 12 years of age at time of games. Juniors must have their own insurance and be able to provide proof ie. EA number.
- These games will be run in accordance with the NSW Police Games rules and regulations.
- Australian Standards approved riding helmets and correct riding footwear must be worn by all riders when riding including warm up areas.
- Service or Agency uniforms are permitted
- Competitors may compete in 3 open **dressage** tests ONLY if they are not jumping.
- Participants can only enter **combined training** at two consecutive levels, ie. Preparatory and prelim or 60cm and 80cm
- Entering **combined training** or **One Day Event** will also enter you in the equivalent open dressage and open show jumping IF YOU HAVE PAID THE CAPPED FEE.
- No more than two horses per rider.
- Callers are only permitted for open **dressage**. Callers in tests for **combined training** are prohibited and will result in elimination from the combined training event.
- Back protectors MUST be worn during the **cross country** phase.
- Dressage callers and whips NOT permitted for **One Day Event /Combined Training** Dressage Tests however they are permitted for Open Dressage tests and combined training.
- NSW Police Games medals will be awarded to third place in all events.
- Special Sashes will also be presented for high point awards and **Hack/Hunter/ Western** championships and Supremes.
- **ODE/ Combined Training** dressage - If a competitor is riding down 2 levels from their open dressage, penalties MAY be awarded to keep it fair. This will be decided in consultation with the competitor at the discretion of the coordinators.
- Participants competing in the **Combined Training** are not eligible to compete in the **One Day Event** and vice versa.
- Horses competing in the **Hack classes** cannot compete in the **Hunter** classes or **Western** Classes and vice versa
- Snaffle bits only for all Novice, Newcomer and Young Horse classes.
- Winners of classes in **Hack, Hunter, Western** and **Rider** classes are eligible to compete for champion Hack/Hunter/Western/Rider in their division. Horses that placed second to the eventual Champion are eligible to challenge for Reserve Champion.
- All Champions are eligible to compete for Supreme
- **Novice** - Has not won a similar or higher level class at a similar or higher level competition. Snaffle bit only.
- **Intermediate** - Has not won a similar or higher level class at a similar or higher level competition.
- **Open** - Has won at a similar or lower level at a similar or higher level competition.
- **Youth** – Rider is 12yrs and over but under 18 year of age at time of competition.
- **Beginner** – A person/horse who has never placed at organised shows
- **Open** – A class for riders who have placed at organised shows.
- **Showmanship at Halter** – It involves a person on the ground leading a horse, wearing a halter or bridle, through a series of manoeuvres called a pattern. The horse itself is not judged on its conformation. Rather, the exhibitor is judged on how well he or she exhibits the animal to its best advantage, with additional scoring for the grooming and presentation of both horse and handler.
- **Hunter Under Saddle** – The Hunter Under Saddle class aims to show the horse's movements between jumps. The Hunter Under Saddle horse must travel longer but still very evenly, rhythmically and calmly. The seat is more active, the stirrups shorter as for hunting. The pace is ground covering, the gait flat and smooth. The horse will have a far longer stride and as a result, be travelling faster, but it is the length of stride rather than speed which will be judged. Mandatory class requirements are walk, trot and canter each way around the arena on the rail. Reverse is asked for only from halt, walk, and trot. A backup is required. An extended trot or hand gallop can be requested.
- **Hunt Seat Equitation** – This is a riding class with a set pattern which changes for each show. The class is then required to work on the arena rail as per Hunter Under Saddle.
- **Western Horsemanship** - is a riding class with a set pattern which is changed for each show. The group will be asked to work around the arena 'on the rail' as for Western Pleasure.
- **Western Pleasure** – All riding for Western Pleasure classes is done with almost no contact with the Bit. The horse is obedient to the lightest lift' or touch of the rein against the neck and contact with the leg and seat. Class requirements

are: Mandatory to go around the arena both ways at a walk, a jog, a lope. You may be asked to change direction from the halt, walk or jog only. You must back up when asked to. An extended jog may be asked for.

- Competitors must nominate for Individual and Team Point score on the Entry Form.
